

Former Klamath Residents Write Friends of Boat Trip Down Yukon River in Alaska

On May 23, Mr. and Mrs. R. W. "Bob" Browning, formerly of Klamath Falls, sailed for Alaska from Seattle. Equipped with a light 16 foot canvas King boat and a Muncie outboard motor, as well as their camp outfit, Mr. and Mrs. Browning are now cruising down the Yukon. They have set the head waters of the Kuskokwim river as their objective, and by many hard hours of travel expect to reach that point by the first of August.

Mr. and Mrs. Browning will remain in Alaska for an indefinite period of time. They plan to stay for a year, but if they like the country and find any exceptional opportunities, they may locate there permanently. Several interesting excerpts from letters written by Mr. and Mrs. Browning are reprinted here. The first is from a letter written by "Bob" to A. D. Lambert, of this city. The letter is post marked June 23, Ft. Yukon. The second group is taken from a letter written by "Peggy" Browning to Mrs. Lambert, postmarked July 3, Tanana, Alaska. In spite of the difference in the dates of the two letters, they arrived almost simultaneously.

Mr. Browning Writes
Dear A. D.:
We are now holed up on an island in the Yukon about 20 miles below Circle City. We intended to go through to Ft. Yukon today, but could only run about three hours. The wind came up and my motor ran out of gas. It was too rough to fill it up in mid stream so we pulled to shore. Peggy took the rope and jumped to the shore, but the bank caved in, and Peggy went into the river up to her waist. We built a fire and dried her out, and started again in about an hour, but the wind had grown steadily worse, and it started to rain. The playful wind plucked white caps and tossed them into our faces, until we decided to go ashore and pitch tent.

We got into Circle City last night about six, and if we had wished to stay up until midnight, we would have seen the sun shining, but we didn't think it worth while, for soon we will run into country where the sun shines 24 hours a day.

Motor Works Perfectly
My motor hasn't missed a beat in approximately 600 miles of steady going. We have passed through some wonderful country but we are sure hitting it at the wrong time of year. It seems funny, but we haven't killed any game, nor caught a single fish. The graying is the only game fish they have up here, and they have all gone to the heads of the small creeks to spawn. They catch white fish with nets, but they say that they are not good, and no one eats them but the Indians. We saw a caribou, two moose and three bear over in the Yukon territory, but we didn't have our guns. I don't think I would kill anything anyway. It would just be a waste as we couldn't do for much meat.

Gas Price High
They sure hook you on almost everything you need up here, especially gasoline. At White Horse we bought 20 gallons at 75 cents per, and 5 gallons at Circle City for 80 cents a gallon. People tell us that it will drop as we get back toward Fairbanks. The whole country is timbered with cottonwood, birch and spruce, all more or less scrubby stuff, but just the right size for log cabins. There are plenty of deserted cabins along the river too. We are down in the flats now, and will have them for about 300 miles, pretty hard navigating as there is only one current, and a mass of islands and sloughs. I believe we are the first to come down the river in a King boat or a Muncie motor, that is, according to the mounted police in Darwin. I am getting tougher than an owl, and Peggy is grabbing things and throwing them around that she could never even have lifted before. Mosquitoes are positively aw-

ful, two weeks ago they nearly drove us crazy, but now, with our head nets, and a smudge once in a while, we are coming to accept them as a matter of course.

Mrs. Browning's Letter
Tanana, Alaska,
July 3, 1930
We have had so many things happen that I hardly know where to begin. We are having the trip of our lives, a good many hardships, but we are not daunted, we are still headed for the Kuskokwim, and expect to get there by August 1st. Have traveled 1160 miles to date, and our motor is holding up splendidly, but the boat is a little frail for these rocks. However, we take it out, dope it up, and believe we will make the portage with it anyway.

Fun With Bear
The other morning we started out early, and saw a bear swimming in the river, so I grabbed the kodak and Bob started after him. I got some pictures as close as seven feet, and we chased him around quite a bit. Pretty soon he got tired of this sport, and started back our way, and we touched him with the bow of our boat. It dawned upon us all at once, that we had a canvas boat, and that with one sweep of his paw, he could rip the whole side out, so Bob took out the 22 and shot him. The bear was about a 2 year old, so we skinned out the hams and the meat is the best stuff I ever tasted. More like venison than anything else.

The biggest thrill we have had was in Dawson. We stopped on the Klondike side, and the bridge to Dawson was out, so we had to cross in a box, pulled over by a rope on a cable. The old Klondike was just roaring, and nothing between it and us except that box, my! it was thrilling. Last Sunday we got a pretty good scare. Tried to cross the river to get some mail, and believe me, we had a narrow escape. The waves were coming into the boat from all sides, and if Bob hadn't kept his head, we would have lost our while outfit, if not our own lives. He headed the boat up the river, and in that way we finally made it across. I pulled off my mackinaw, and held on to a life pillow, wishing that I had practiced swimming more.

One Car in Town
There is only one car in this town, and it is an old 1923 Dodge. There are four stores, two eating places, an old church and a few dwelling down the main street, this town has gone down so much since the fort was abandoned. Must quit now and make us some bear sandwiches.

FIND BODY OF YOUTH LOST ON MOUNTAIN SIDE

Howard Lamel Fell Over 300-Foot Cliff On Mt. Whitney

LOME PINE, Calif., July 18 (A P)—Found Wednesday at the bottom of a 300-foot crevasse, approximately 700 feet from the Summit of Mount Whitney, the body of Howard Lamel, 18-year-old Los Angeles hiker, today was brought out to civilization.

Lamel, his neck broken and his body badly crushed by a 100-yard fall, was found by Bob Evans, first man to scale Mount Whitney in the winter, and Norman Clyde, writer of mountain stories. They were unable to carry out the body immediately.

Lamel had been missing since July 5, when with his father, a brother and a chum, he started to climb Mount Whitney, highest peak in the United States. He attempted to scale the 14,501-foot mountain from its precipitous east side, a feat only once before successfully performed. Evans and Clyde said Lamel had fallen from a slippery ledge. Lamel's father, brother and chum successfully climbed the west side of the mountain. When they returned to camp at the 10,000-foot level young Howard had not returned, and an alarm was spread. Early this week the search on the mountain was discontinued, except by Evans and Clyde, and the upper reaches of the Kern river, leading down from the mountains, were combed. It was thought that Lamel, experienced in woodcraft, despite his youth, might have been following the river to civilization.

Senate to Receive Expense Figures

Senator Fred Steiwer's resolution calling for the appointment of a committee of the senate to secure figures of expenses by different counties in the United States in which Indian reservations are located, has passed the senate, according to word received here by County Commissioner Charles R. Williams, he stated yesterday. The resolution calls for figures to be gathered similar to those submitted by Klamath county in its claim against the federal government for return of money invested or spent in administration on the Klamath Indian reservation.

Klamath county asks the return of approximately \$4,500,000 which has been spent in roads, bridges, schools, and in administration of schools and legal agencies for which the county expended the money in the past 10 years. The senate committee to gather the figures has not yet been appointed, Senator Steiwer informed Commissioner Williams.
