

PARENTS FIND BABIES NEVER WERE MIXED UP

Bamberger-Watkins Case In Chicago Comes to Settlement

CHICAGO, July 25, (AP)—The mix-up over the Bamberger-Watkins babies was ironed out at an early morning conference today, at which it was decided the babies of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Bamberger and Mr. and Mrs. Watkins were never mixed up at all.

This decision, reached by agreement between the parents, was opposed to that of a group of scientists who late yesterday decided the babies had been switched at Englewood hospital, where they were born.

Dr. Kegel Astounded
Dr. Arnold Kegel, health commissioner, was astounded when informed of the decision. He said he would consider whether to pursue the case further in the interest of public policy.

The parents, apparently in complete accord, took the babies and went home. They said the incident was closed as far as they are concerned.

The parents had demanded an investigation following the discovery of an adhesive tape on the back of the Bamberger baby bore the name "Watkins" and a similar tape on the Watkins baby was marked "Bamberger." They now believe the tapes had been washed off at the hospital when both babies were being bathed and a nurse, in haste, had put them back on the wrong infants.

Shape of Heads Decides
The shape of the babies' heads was responsible for the final agreement. The Bambergers' baby was their third. The Watkins' baby was a first-born. A committee of physicians who met with the parents last night agreed a temporarily oval shaped head, such as the Watkins' baby has, is natural in the case of a first-born. The Bamberger baby's head is found.

John Loughnane, attorney for the Watkins and the Bambergers, announced if Dr. Kegel took any steps to force the parents to exchange babies, a writ of injunction would be filed against him.

The agreement as to parentage was reached at a conference held at the Keystone hospital parti-

cipated in by the parents and six physicians.

Following the action of Dr. Kegel's commission yesterday, Watkins announced himself willing to agree and to switch babies. Bamberger, however, refused and with Mrs. Bamberger and the baby disappeared. He also announced he would resist any attempt to take the baby by force. This brought a statement from Watkins to the effect he would seek the child by court action.

While Dr. Kegel was attempting to locate Bamberger last night the parents met at the Keystone hospital and finally accepted the decision of the physicians the babies they have are really their own.

Three Story Fall Fatal to Logger

Two companions, William Kenny and Donald Faherty were held for questioning by the district attorney.

Faherty told police that they had "a couple of drinks." Keener then started across the room for some water, Faherty said, "stag-gered and fell through the glass."
