

RACE EVENTS OPEN SATURDAY

Horse races of all kinds, a play-off baseball game for the championship of Eastern Klamath, and a dance will be on the program at Bly Saturday and Sunday. The entertainment is being sponsored by the Bly Civic Club.

Poultrymen Urge Demonstration of Poultry in State

CORVALLIS, July 25, (AP)—A resolution suggesting a poultry demonstration train be taken through Oregon to better acquaint poultrymen with modern and efficient methods of the industry, was adopted by the Oregon Poultry Association at the conclusion of its annual convention here late yesterday. The plan is to operate the train on a similar schedule to that used by the recent "Dairy Special."

The poultrymen talked of other methods of publicity and advertising designed to acquaint the public with poultry products and the best methods of the industry. Interest in the advertising phases was aroused by an address by Charles D. Byrne, head of the industrial journalism department at the State College, who said an examination of one issue of 60 newspapers in Oregon revealed only one direct advertisement to poultry products.

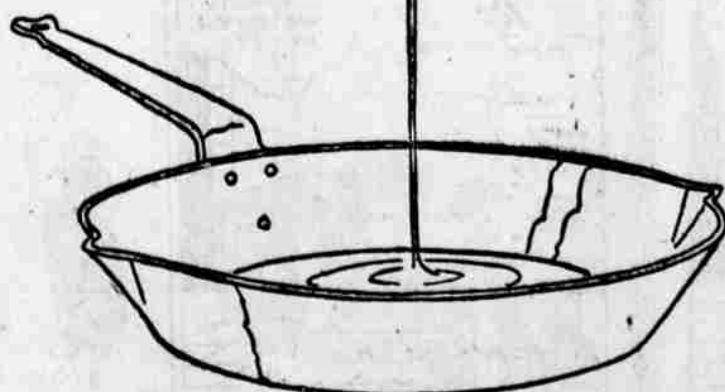
