Lehman and Couch Enter Final Heat In Amateur Play

CHICAGO, July 15. (AP)—A pair of young Chicago golfers, Johnny Lehman and Ira Couch, both well known in their own ballworld—but little known outside—squared off today in the 36-hole battle over Beverly country club's narrow fairways for the western amateur title.

Lehman, who took the big ten championship to Purdue three years ago, was favored to win the trophy today because of his consistently brilliant play throughout the tournament.

He started off by sharing medalist honors and then eliminating the defending champion, Don Moe of Portland, Ore., whose triumphs piled yesterday before his performance in defeating a former British amateur champion, T. Phillip Perkins, now a resident of New York.

Lehman not only removed the methodical British, who started the gallery Thursday by blinding over the difficult layout in 69 per-blasting strokes but did it in an overwhelming manner—8 up and 7 to play.

Couch displayed plenty of staying quality in defeating Bob McCrary, the fighting Scot of Des Moines, to reach the championship round. A less steady golfer would have cracked when McCrary stepped out and won the first three holes. Couch, however, stayed with it and as they made the turn in the morning round, was one up.

MARKET QUOTATIONS

PORTLAND, July 26. (AP)—Fresh extra eggs have been advanced 2c to 24c and standards 1c to 24c, according to announcement of the Pacific Co-operative Poultry Producers, who are said to control about 40 per cent of the output. This advance follows the stiffening in price which has characterized the top grades for several days. Some independent dealers, it is reported, have not observed such an advance.

The butter market was barely steady under liberal receipts. Shipments of tomatoes from the Dalles are reported unusually large. The best stock brings a good price, with the inferior stock selling as low as 25c a box.

Watermelons are somewhat cheaper, cantaloupes are steady, peaches and plums are in good demand.

EGGS: Prices to retailers, fresh extras, 24c; standards, 24c; fresh medium, 22c. Prices to wholesalers 2c under price to retailers.
