A Medal of Honor for Admiral Byrd



The National Geographic Society's Special Medal of Honor, pictured here, was presented to Rear Admiral Richard E. Byrd by President Hoover at White House ceremonies honoring the famous explorer. The face of the medal (left) bears a profile bust of Admiral Byrd, an inscription of the two stars and anchor of a rear admiral's insignia, and the wings, shield and anchor of a naval aviator. On the reverse side of the medal (right) is a symbolic figure—a winged man conquering the two poles.

Istanbul Visited By Death Dealing Tornado and Hail

ISTANBUL, Turkey, July 28 (AP)—A tornado and hailstorm killed 20 persons and injured hundreds in Adrianople yesterday. Eighty per cent of the houses were destroyed and crops in the surrounding country were ruined.

Nine minarets crashed to the ground, as did the tower of the four minarets atop the famous mosque of the Sultan Selim, one of the greatest treasures of Moslem art.

AM Rushed
The Red Cross society, or Turkish Red Cross, has rushed aid from Istanbul.
Adrianople is an important port city of Turkey, located at the juncture of the Tuna and Maritima rivers. It is one of the most populous towns in European Turkey after Istanbul and is a great trade center for textiles and perfumery. From 1366 to 1453 it was the capital of the Ottoman empire. The present population of Adrianople is about 60,000. It is a picturesque community of mosques and most of the buildings are in decided Ottoman style, many of them being of quite ancient origin.
