MARKET QUOTATIONS
 PORTLAND, July 30. (AP)—Top grades eggs were firm today at the recent advance. The price of off-quality eggs, however, were reported as being shaded by some dealers.
 Butter supplies were liberal with moderate trading, but there were no changes in prices. Some shipments were made to outside markets. San Francisco and Los Angeles reported advances on 90 score and above.
 Reviewing the fruit and vegetable market, the Portland bureau of the U. S. department of agriculture says:
 Team-truck holding of 125 cars of fresh fruits and vegetables Monday, of which half were watermelons, marks the heaviest volume of supplies in the city at any one time this year. Yesterday's arrivals were light, with only 20 cars compared with 81 cars received over the week-end, and Tuesday morning witnessed a reduction in truck-holdings to 100 cars.
 Peaches, watermelons, cantaloupes and tomatoes all declined since Monday, under pressure of liberal receipts. California peaches are of fine quality, and prices are unusually low, at 90c-\$1.00 per box of Elbertas, and \$1.25 for fine highly-colored J. H. Hales. California Klondike watermelons sold as low as \$27.00 per ton to Portland jobbers. Tomatoes from The Dalles moved at 30c-\$1.00 per 15-lb. box of No. 1's, while a few fancy sold 25c higher. Fine-quality tomatoes from Walla Walla sold in 30-lb. boxes to retailers as high as \$3.25-\$3.50.

 QUARANTINE APPROVED
 SALEM, Ore., July 30 (AP)—Governor Norblad today approved an order to the state board of horticulture declaring a quarantine against the shipment of California strawberry plants into Oregon. The reason for the order is the presence of a disease known as strawberry "yellow" among California plantings.

CRATER BEARS DESERT CAMP
 CRATER LAKE, Ore., July 30. (Special)—Park officials are wondering what has caused the bears to refuse to come to park headquarters as they did in former years. Even Jimina, the grandmother of the Crater Lake bear tribe, is seldom seen by the park visitors. Early this spring at least a dozen of these animals were to be seen in the vicinity almost every day. As time passed the bears gradually quit coming. Now even Fritz and his family are no longer making their evening visits.
 One explanation offered is that the old mesa house had been torn down after the bears had begun their long winter sleep, and being used to it the animals felt out of place around the new building. Another suggestion offered is that the garbage of this season does not satisfy the bear's appetite.
