

OPENING DATE OF HOTEL ELK IS ANNOUNCED

Du Vaul States Hotel In Hirvi Building Near Completion

William DuVaul, who will be the proprietor of the new Hotel Elk in the Hirvi building, announced yesterday that he has purchased the most modern and up-to-date equipment available for his hostelry.

Work Being Rushed
The halls and lobbies of the hotel will be covered with thick carpets. Mr. DuVaul states that in addition to the lobby on the first floor there will be a lobby and waiting room on the second and third floors for the convenience of guests.

Workmen are busily finishing the plastering and the placing of window frames. The floors are being laid and it is expected that the hotel will be open by September 1, although the opening date of the strictly modern, 90-room hotel has not yet been announced.

Walls Sound Proof
A feature of the rooms will be the sound proof double-walls, with a four inch dead-air space. Radio receivers connected with a master set will also be placed in each room.

Rev. Guy DeVries, pastor of Klamath Temple, has received a definite missionary call to Para, Brazil, and has resigned the pastorate here to accept the call. Accompanied by Mrs. DeVries and little son Elwood, Rev. DeVries will sail for the new post some time in November.

Rev. DeVries has been pastor of Klamath Temple for over three years, during which time many additions have been made and a church building program gotten under way. He has tendered his resignation to take effect September 15, at which time he and his family will start for New York by motor.

Rev. Fred Hornshub, present pastor of the Lighthouse temple at Eugene, will succeed Rev. DeVries as pastor of Klamath Temple. He will assume charge Sept. 14th.

Boop-a-Doop Girl Called to Court

NEW YORK, Aug. 14 (AP)—Helen Kane, the boop-a-doop girl, is restrained under a supreme court order from touching \$40,000 in her account in the Plaza Trust company.

The order was issued at the instance of counsel for the creditors of the Bond Dress company, in bankruptcy proceedings, who charged Murray J. Posner, a partner in the firm, gave the money to Miss Kane out of funds which rightfully belonged to the creditors.

Denies Charge
CHICAGO, Aug. 13. (AP)—Helen Kane, who is boop-a-dooping in a local theatre, denied charges by creditors of the bankrupt Bond Dress company, in New York, that Murray J. Posner, a partner in the dress firm, had given her \$40,000.

The creditors obtained an injunction in the New York state supreme court restraining Miss Kane from touching her account in a New York bank. They charged Posner gave Miss Kane the money out of funds which belonged to creditors.

"Mr. Posner is a friend of mine," said Miss Kane, "but I never heard of this money business. Maybe I've been more dooped against than dooping."

PIEDMONT CLUB TO ERECT HOME

Plans Call for Clubhouse; Work Continues On Course

Announcement of plans for the construction of plans for the future of a \$4,000 clubhouse at the Piedmont Golf and Country club grounds, was made yesterday by officials of the club.

Work has already been started on a driving course which will accommodate 25 players at one

time at the club grounds near the junction of the Dalles-California and Lakeview highways.

Build Driving Course
A driving trough, shaded for sunny days, is being erected and a field put in condition. It is expected that within 19 days the driving course will be ready for the use of the members of the club.

The nine-hole golf course is being put in condition. An expert greens man is at work cutting the grass on the fairways and conditioning the greens. The fairways and greens are being sprinkled and by spring the course will be one of the best in southern Oregon.

It is built in an ideal spot with natural water hazards and the course was laid out by an expert. Sufficient ground is ad-

acent to the nine hole course to enlarge it to 18 holes when the proper time arrives.

A sand green is being installed for practice shots and more sprinklers are being put in to insure the fairways of plenty of water during the rainless season. Additional seed is also being planted on the fairways and greens.

Plans for the clubhouse call for a one story frame structure, with a large southern type veranda on the east side to allow a view of the course.

A large club room which can be converted into a dance floor will be decorated with a fireplace, and a barbecue kitchen will be built in.

Dances Planned
During the winter months dances will be held at the club-

house for members of the club and their lady friends.

The land for the course was purchased from the Slater Investment company in this city, and Mr. Slater is instrumental in securing the early erection of the clubhouse. Plans have already been completed and it is expected that the building will rise in the next few weeks.

VANCOUVER SEES POLO

VANCOUVER, B. C., Aug. 14. (AP)—The Earl Lewis polo team of Tacoma defeated Vancouver 8-4 yesterday to win the Thaddeus Lane international polo trophy. It was the first time the trophy was captured by a United States aggregation since 1924.

State Vehicles To Be Repainted Soon

Any company interested in bidding on the job for repainting all vehicles of the state traffic division to conform with the black and white color scheme which it has been decided these vehicles shall bear is asked to call at the chamber of commerce and procure bid blanks.

A number of these bids have been sent out to Oregon cities, many of them going to garages where cars are repainted, by Carl Abrams, secretary of the board of control.

All colored parts in motorcycles and side cars, as at present finished, are to be white. Small parts, spokes and rims of wheels,

parts of the engine, will be finished in black.

For the cars, the body above the belt course, spokes and rim of wheels, entire chassis and under parts of fenders are to be black lacquer. Lower part of body, top of fenders, hood, splash guards, hub flanges and radiator shutters are to be white lacquer.
