Carnival, Boxing Card And Dance on Labor Day Activities

The Labor Day celebration this year will be held on Klamath avenue between Second and Third streets, C. D. Long, chairman of the Central Labor Council, said last night. The C. H. Steffens company of Oakland, Cal., will furnish amusement features. Mr. Steffens is here now completing arrangements.

The Steffens shows played Klamath Falls on two previous occasions, on Labor Day, 1926 and 1927. The public was well pleased with the clean conduct of the show on both these occasions, Mr. Long stated.

No Parade Planned

The Labor Council of Klamath Falls plans on holding an annual celebration, the funds derived from various events to be used for building purposes.

Owing to the fact that merchants of this city have entered floats in several parades this year, it was decided to abandon the Labor Day parade, which had originally been planned. The Labor Day celebration is not competing with the county fair as it has in the past, owing to the later date of the county fair.

Plan Dances

The Steffens shows consist of many new and novel features. Concessions are all under the auspices of the Central Labor Union. Dances will be held on the "49 Village" platform, in the center of the carnival lot, and the popular jittery dance will be featured. Baldy Evans and his orchestra will furnish the music.

Promoter Joe Bickerstaff will stage the fight card in the Legion hall on Monday, Labor Day night, under the auspices of the Labor Council.
