Rankins Making Record Trying to Start Time Flight

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 25. (AP)—For the third time, Ted and Dick Rankins have been thwarted in their attempt to set a new endurance refueling record. Last night at 9:35, after being in the air six hours, a broken oil line forced down the On-to-Oregon monoplane on Swan Island airport. The fliers being unable to reach their own base of operations.

Twelve gallons of oil sprayed over the pilots before they were landed. They circled the airport several times dropping flares to signal for the light to be turned on. Receiving no response they dropped the emergency flare and landed by its light. Ted Rankins insisted if the motor was not injured, they would make another try.
