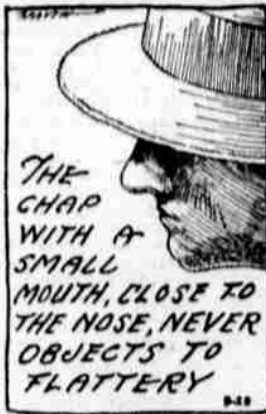


# NEWS IN BRIEF
