

DON'T POUR YOUR PROFITS INTO THE BULGING POCKETS OF FOREIGN GREED

The Nation Wages a War Against an Intolerable Chain-Store Condition, Which, If Allowed to Survive, will be Followed by Socialism, Bolshevism, Anarchy, Revolution, National Death

There really is no greater or more important question before the people, and especially the Christian people of America, than the future of the independent industry and our future generations. This is a national problem. For centuries the people of Europe have been trying to throw off the yoke of centralized power and capital which has caused them dire sorrow and suffering. But the people of America have lived so free and independently it is most difficult for them to realize this same freedom and independence is jeopardized by systems which are enveloping the nation like some mighty web. There is no one in any walk of life, whether it be spiritual, professional, political or industrial, who is safeguarded. The purpose of "Chain Stores" is to control prices, prevent competition, cheapen the cost of production, to cheapen labor, and to accumulate wealth out of the sweat of the brow of honest toilers by means of combinations, and monopolies. These practices by Chains are often labeled as "Distribution Without Waste," "Economic Rendering Methods" or "Economists in Distribution."

On September 11, 1918, when Herbert Hoover was food administrator to President Wilson, he said: "I scarcely need to repeat the views that I expressed to you nearly a year ago—that there is a growing and dangerous domination of the handling of the nation's foodstuffs. . . . The problem we have to consider, however is the ultimate social result of this expanding domination, and whether it can be replaced by a system of better social character, and of equal economic efficiency for the present, and of greater promise for the future. It is certain to my mind, that these businesses have been economically efficient in their period of competitive upgrowth, but as time goes on, this efficiency can not fail to diminish and, like all monopolies, begin to defend itself by repression, rather than by efficiency. The worst social result of this growth in domination of trades is the undermining of the initiative and the equal opportunity of our people and the tyranny which necessarily follows in the commercial world." This terse statement by Mr. Hoover is almost prophetic, in the light of present conditions.

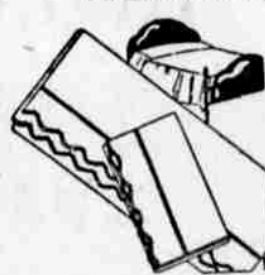
