Revolution Seething In Brazil Gov't.

suspended air mail service out of the country on the pan-American, Condor and French aero-postal lines.

News filtering through Brazilian border points into Uruguay indicated that eight of the 21 states of Brazil are driving forward to unseat the federal government of President Luis and prevent the inauguration of the president-elect, Dr. Julio Prestes November 15.

Troops Join Revolt

The leader of the movement, which began in the southernmost state of Rio Grande do Sul, Francisco Flores da Cunha, asserted today that the states of Parana, Santa Catarina, Piahy, Ceara, Rio Grande do Norte, Parahyba and Minas Geraes, were backing his campaign, with the federal troops and thousands of civilians joining the revolting forces.

Meanwhile, the federal government has declared a state of siege in Rio Grande do Sul and Minas Geraes, and had appropriated \$10,000,000 to put down the rebellion. The government also is said to have offered to make peace—with the insurrectionists refusing all such overtures.

To Attack Seaport

Da Cunha is understood to be planning an attack on the great seaport of Sao Paulo. His Rio Grande do Sul army, reinforced with conscripts between the ages of 21 and 35, is moving northward through Santa Catarina, and intends to concentrate in the state of Parana, which borders the state of Sao Paulo on the south. Then, it is said, with a railway line along their route they will move upon the great coffee port.

General da Cunha in a statement today said that if the revolution were triumphant a provisional government would be established, with elections to be called eventually.

Inspection of Mail Routes Commenced

Charles C. Willmore, superintendent of mails, has commenced his semi-annual inspection of the city carrier routes for the postal department. The inspection is required by the postal authorities in Washington, D. C., and a report is to be sent to them.

The inspection covers all the mail handled in the post office in this city. The mail is weighed, counted and the distance checked by a pedagogue. The results are checked to see if any of the routes need adjustment. Ten city delivery routes in Klamath Falls and two parcel post routes are to come under inspection.

"Since the last inspection the residential section of the city has expanded and built up to such an extent that several carriers have been unable to deliver mail on the schedule time. These routes may have to be re-adjusted," Postmaster McCall commented.

Seven Arrests Made By Police Officers
