

LAURA INGALLS LOWERS RECORD

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Oct. 9. (AP)—Battling storms and dropping through dense mountain fog during the last 300 miles of a trans-Atlantic flight, Laura Ingalls, diminutive 25 year old aviatrix, today had established a new record for fliers of her sex to shoot at an elapsed time mark of 30 hours, 27 minutes, for flying across the United States.

The aviatrix made the crossing in the same plane with which she recently set the world's record of 714 barrel rolls and the women's record of 950 consecutive loops. Miss Ingalls is a transport pilot and has been flying two years. She won third place last summer in the Dixie air derby, held in connection with the national air races at Chicago. Miss Ingalls said the last leg of the flight was the worst of the entire trip.

"Besides terrific head winds, I struck up and down draughts, clouds, rain squalls and fog," she said. "I was glad to see Los Angeles loom up on the horizon."

After completing the flight yesterday, Miss Ingalls said she would take off again today in an effort to set a mark for an eastward flight.

The westward flight is the first to be recognized as setting a record for women by the National Aeronautic association. Miss Ingalls' plane is a light, open-cockpit D-H Moth biplane, powered with a Wright-Gypsy motor. She was accompanied by a Curtiss Robin service plane piloted by Milford Sater and Ross Mahachek.

Mr. and Mrs. R. F. Gorham and L. Turnbaugh went to Gearhart mountain, near Paisley, to join a party of friends deer hunting.

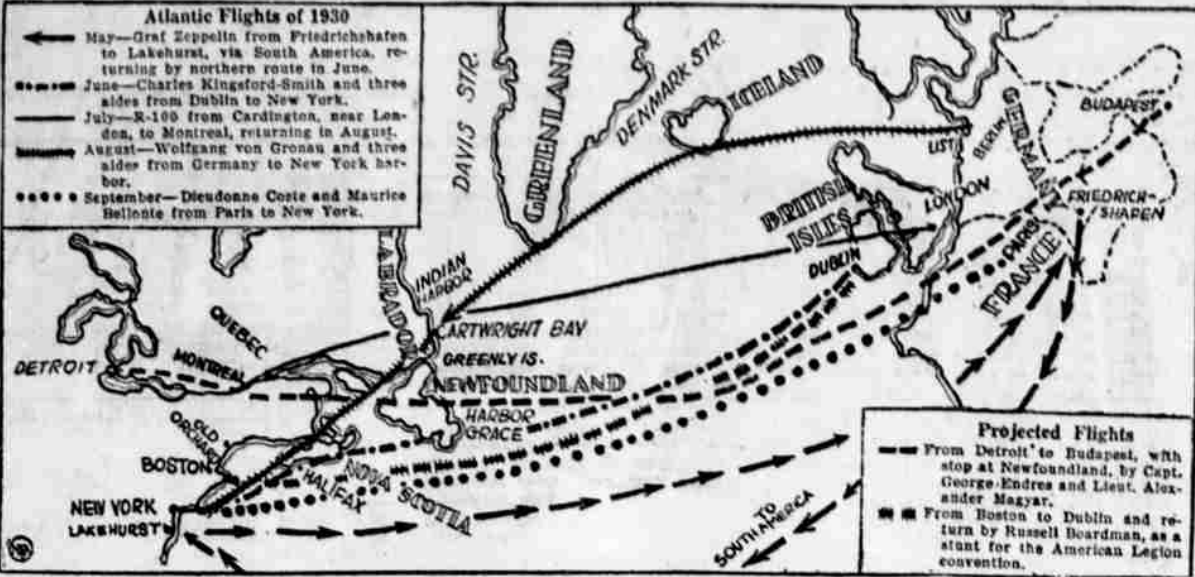

Atlantic Conquered by Air 7 Times in 1930



The year 1930 seems destined to go down in history as a banner season for trans-Atlantic flights, the recent westward crossing by Cote and Bellotte being the seventh successful oceanic air voyage of the year, as well as the first ever to be made from the continent to the United States. The above map shows the routes of the two dirigibles, Graf Zeppelin and R-100, both of which twice crossed the ocean, and the routes of the three successful airplane flights as well as the proposed itinerary of two other heavier-than-air expeditions expected to start soon. The Graf Zeppelin was first to

span the Atlantic this year, coming to Lakehurst by way of South America and returning over the northern route. The R-100 crossed the North Atlantic on its way to Montreal as well as on the return journey. The German flyers, headed by Wolfgang von Gronau, made their flight in a series of hops, while Charles Kingsford-Smith, the Australian, spanned the ocean in one jump, but was forced to land at Newfoundland before continuing to New York City. The projected flights of Russell Beardsman to Ireland and return and of Captain Endres from Detroit to Budapest also are shown.
