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SOLOIST TELLS OF GOOD MUSIC

Robert Clark, feature trombonist and soloist of the United States Marine band, thinks that all who are musically inclined can appreciate the best types of music—but a lot of people won't admit it, he adds.

"It's a funny thing," observed Mr. Clark in a recent interview, "but most people won't admit



they like good music. They are afraid of appearing 'high hat.' Most people have a queer idea of good music. They think that in order for music to be good, it must be highly technical and beyond the comprehension of anybody but musicians. There is a wealth of classic music that is well within the appreciation of all who have an ear for melody.

Schubert, Chopin, Strauss and many others have given us songs that are far more beautiful and appealing than any of the modern popular airs. I have watched an untrained audience respond to a classic symphony—or solo number—with greater eagerness than any 'jazz' tune could possibly arouse. And yet many people will tell you they can't stand the 'high-brow stuff.' But they will whistle or dance to a tune that was 'lifted' right out of an opera or symphony."

Mr. Clark has a broad appreciation of musical tastes, as he has traveled around the world with many famous bands. His solos are selected with the idea to please—and to add artistic value to the performance. Audiences are fortunate, indeed, in having the opportunity to hear this premier trombone soloist when the United States Marines band comes to the Pelican.

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
