

TEXT OF JAPAN PACT REACHES NEW YORK CITY

NEW YORK, Oct. 17, (AP)—The official text of Japan's ratification of the London naval treaty was here today, brought across the continent by air courier on its way from Tokyo to London.

Lieutenant Irving A. Woodring landed at Mitchell Field last night, ending the last stage of a dash from Victoria, B. C., with the document which was brought from Japan on a fast steamship.

Pierre De L. Baol, assistant in the division of western European affairs of the state department, will board the Leviathan with it tomorrow to deliver it to Ambassador Matsudaira in London.

The ratification is being rushed to get it to London before the opening of the session of the league of nations disarmament commission at Geneva.

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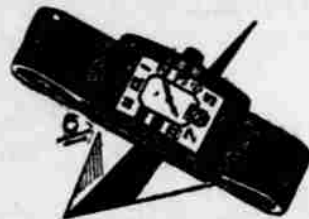
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
