

SHRINE PATROL WILL DRILL FOR FOOTBALL FANS

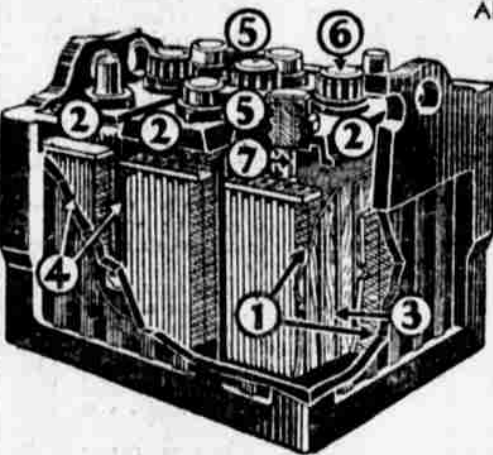
