

ARMORY MOVE IS EXPLAINED

Favorable comment was expressed at the meeting of the Central Labor Council Wednesday night here when Capt. Walter W. Abbey and First Sgt. Dewey Powell explained the measures to appear on the city and county ballots calling for the building of a National Guard Armory in Klamath Falls.

Captain Abbey called the attention of those present to the fact that an Armory is in reality a community building and available for the use of any organization or group. C. D. Long presided at the meeting. N. H. Cantor, commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars expressed the endorsement of his organization on the Armory question and urged the support of the members of the Keno Grange.

Hearty endorsement of the movement to build an Armory in Klamath Falls was expressed by Doug Puckett, who acted as chairman of the Grange meeting held in Keno Wednesday night. Capt. Walter W. Abbey and First Sergeant Dewey Powell of Battery "D" spoke for the Armory and explained the measures to appear on the ballot November 4th and the uses to which the proposed building will be put as a community center. N. H. Cantor, commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars expressed the endorsement of his organization on the Armory question and urged the support of the members of the Keno Grange.

Will Test School Boy Patrol System

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 24. (AP)—Silverton has been selected as the place to try out the school boy patrol system, which is being sponsored in Oregon by the State motor association. The plan was formulated by the state traffic division in a conference with representatives of the motor association and city and school authorities of Silverton.

Arrangements were made for the selection of 40 school students, to be designated by the school authorities, to act as patrolmen. Twenty of those chosen will perform the duties as outlined by the traffic division, and the other twenty will serve in the capacity of alternates.

Plan Regulation Of Beach Flying

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 24. (AP)—Elimination of promiscuous landings and taking off of airplanes on the smooth stretches of Oregon beaches, and provision instead of designated areas for airplane traffic at coast resorts will be the object of legislation that probably will be considered by the next legislature. This was the tentative plan of representatives of the state board of aeronautics, the state traffic division and the highway department who conferred here yesterday with Secretary of State Hess.

Two Running For Places on Board

Two candidates for election to the board of directors of the Klamath Irrigation District will be voted upon at the district election to be held on November 12.

The petition of Henry Semon was filed in the district office Thursday by Percy Dixon, of the Henley district. E. M. "Gene" Hammond of Merrill filed his petition through J. H. Carnahan, attorney, the early part of the week.

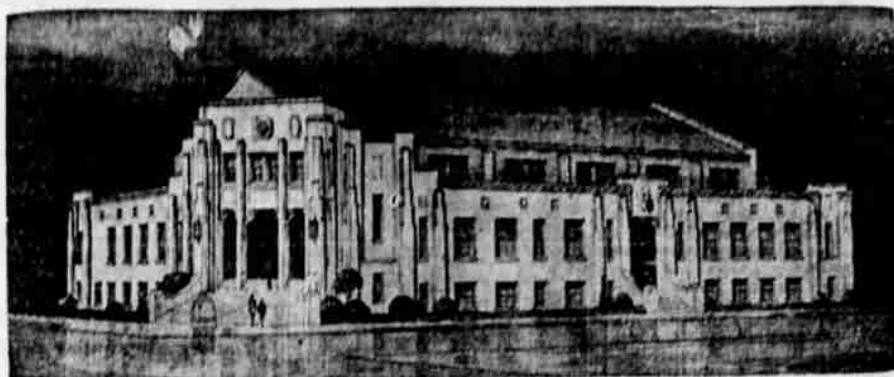

Boat Thought Carrying Rum Sunk by Guard

NEW LONDON, Conn., Oct. 24. (AP)—The speed boat Helen, believed to be a rum-runner, was fired on and sunk early today off Napatree Point, near Watch Hill, R. I., and the speed boat Pueblos was captured by coast guardsmen. Lieutenant Jewell, in command of the C. G. 131, one of two boats which participated in the engagement, said that the crew of the Helen, a 35-footer, was unharmed. The other patrol boat engaged in the affair was the C. G. 234. No liquor was found aboard the

Pueblos. This craft was being towed to the local coast guard base. The number of men aboard the two boats and their names were not revealed.

American Pilot Killed in France

PARIS, Oct. 24. (AP)—Gilbert Lane, an American aviator, and his French flying companion, Pierre Nicolas, were killed today when a plane in which they were taking off from Le Bourget for

Cairo and Addis Ababa, crashed and was destroyed by flames. They were going to Addis Ababa to witness the coronation of Haile Selassie, Emperor of Ethiopia. Lane, who enlisted in the French army during the world war, it is understood, was born in Paris, of an American father and French mother, and was said to have been the youngest aviator in the French army.
