Charge Made That Young School Girl Is Fatally Beaten

BOSTON, Mass., Nov. 12, (AP)—A charge that an 8-year-old Boston school girl was beaten and kicked so severely by two boys in a cloak room that she died is under investigation by Chairman Joseph J. Hurley of the school committee.

Chairman Hurley said yesterday George Carson, through counsel, had charged that his daughter, Dorothea, had died four days after she had been kicked and beaten in the school. According to Carson's complaint, Elizabeth, sister of Dorothea, and a boy student in the same class told of seeing two boys throw the child to the floor and kick her.

Elizabeth also said the act of the boys was in retaliation for being reported by Dorothea for talking during the teacher's absence from the class room.

Planes Crash In Effort To Break Record

NEW YORK, Nov. 12, (AP)—An attempt to shatter the world's airplane endurance record ended in a double misfortune early today, when the "American Legion" burned in a forced landing, and its refueling ship, "Miss Queen," fell into Jamaica bay near the Jamaica sea airport.

Captain John S. Donaldson, promoter and pilot of the endurance ship, was uninjured, but his co-pilot, Edward Welmer, former war flier, suffered a broken ankle and lacerations.

Charles Soule, pilot of the refueling plane, and George Adams, his assistant on the hose, were drowned, but were pulled out of the water uninjured.

The "American Legion" ran out of gas and was forced down on the edge of the airport, catching fire as it landed on a cement roadway. It was completely burned.

"Miss Queen" lost a wing and its landing gear as it settled down in the marshes of the bay. Its motor apparently was not well warmed up, and refused to function after the ship got into the air.
