

OREGON GIVEN LARGE SUM FOR FOREST ROADS

Apportionment of \$5,500,000 to forest highway funds this fall to 29 states and two territories is making more rapid road construction on the national forests, says the United States forest service, Portland, Oregon.

Oregon will receive \$1,334,195, or an increase of \$701,537, and Washington \$1,665,553, or an increase of \$336,929 over 1929 allotments.

In most of the regions receiving forest highway funds, the allocated amount will be more than double that of the last fiscal year. For 1929, Oregon was apportioned \$622,658, and Washington \$332,614, so that the new amounts are over twice the former figures. For five years the annual federal appropriation for forest highways has been \$4,500,000. Under provisions of the Odie-Cotton law, an additional fund of \$5,000,000 became available for the first time last July, to be used in the current fiscal year. Division of these funds for construction of highways within and adjacent to national forests is made on the basis of area and value of the forests. Half the amount is apportioned according to the ratio of the national forest area in a given state to the total area of all the national forests. The other half is divided in proportion to the value of the national forest lands in each state.
