

AMERICAN IS RELIEVED OF MEXICAN GOLD

NOGALES, Ariz., Nov. 21. (A P)—Theodore D. Robinson, former assistant secretary of the navy, declared Mexican customs authorities at Nogales, Sonora, Mexico, held him and Mrs. Robinson under arrest yesterday and confiscated \$320 in Mexican gold. Although the Mexican authorities denied arresting him or his wife, the nephew of the late President Roosevelt today prepared to place the matter in the hands of the state department at Washington.

The Robinsons arrived yesterday from Mexico City, with the gold which the former secretary said he had been unable to exchange for American money previously because banks were closed at Guadalajara, Jalisco. When the train was boarded by customs officers at the Nogales, Sonora, city limits, Robinson produced the gold along with his other personal effects for inspection. He then was accused, he said, of attempting to export the gold in violation of a presidential decree and was held under arrest until the Nogales passenger station was reached. At the station, Javier Larrea, Mexican treasury department official, advised the officers to confiscate the gold, according to Robinson.

Robinson was allowed his freedom and after placing his case in the hands of Maurice Altatter, United States consul at the Sonora City, left for Tucson, Ariz., and the east. Last night at Tucson he reiterated his charges.

"I am going to Washington," he said, "and report the whole affair and leave it in the hands of the state department."

"And I assure you they will not keep that \$320."

Robinson declared after their release he and Mrs. Robinson were escorted to the international line by an armed guard.

MEXICO CITY, Nov. 21. (A P)—Government officials here today had not received any official report of charges by Theodore D. Robinson, former assistant secretary of the navy for the United States, that Mexican customs guards had confiscated \$320 in Mexican gold from him and Mrs. Robinson.

The reports of this episode came as a surprise here in view of Robinson's prominence. He and his wife left here about a week ago for the United States. He was a close friend of Arthur B. Lane, charge d'affaires at the American embassy.

A decree forbidding taking gold out of the country was passed June 26, 1919. It fixed the penalty as confiscation.

LOCAL BUREAU IS EFFICIENT

"Outside of Portland, Klamath Falls has the best bureau of identification in the state of Oregon," stated Stanley McDonald, Chief of the State Bureau of Identification in Portland, recently.

In the past year approximately 1,200 criminals have been checked, their fingerprints taken, and their records investigated by V. G. Klock, in charge of the local bureau. When a prisoner enters the county jail his picture is taken, and seven sets of finger prints are "rolled". One set is sent to the California Bureau of Investigation at Sacramento, one to the Oregon Bureau at Portland, one to the United States Bureau of Department of Justice, one to the Portland police department and one set is kept on file in the local bureau. The seventh set of prints is sent to the old "stamping-ground" of the criminal, after officer Klock checks facts obtained from other bureaus with information gleaned from the criminal himself.

The Klamath bureau has proved itself efficient especially in the case of "vags" with unsavory past records. When a suspicious character is arrested the bureau starts functioning immediately. Before the "vags" sentence is finished in the local jail, his past record has been received by Mr. Klock. If the prisoner is
