**Thanksgiving Pudding**

### Gelatine Plum Pudding

- 1/2 Cup of grapes
  - 1/2 Cup of cooked prunes, stoned and sweetened
  - 1/2 Cup of raisins
  - 1/2 Cup of currants
- Nut meats, pinch of cloves, cinnamon, nutmeg and allspice
- 1 Package of orange or lemon flavored gelatine
- 1 Pint of boiling water
- Dissolve the package of gelatine in the boiling water and add all the other ingredients to the hot gelatine. Mold in any desired shape and serve with whipped cream, sweetened and flavored with vanilla.
