

BOAT AND 374 CASES LIQUOR ARE CAPTURED

MARSHFIELD, Ore., Nov. 28. (AP)—Held up while crossing the Coos bay bar by coast guardsmen, the troller Main, with 374 cases of liquor, was captured last night, as the first rum runner held up on the Coos bay bar.

Captain John Olson was being held here by customs officers, while the boat was confiscated.

The value of the liquor cargo, at contraband prices, was approximately \$4,000. The 374 cases were made up of well known brands.

The troller, a 42-foot craft, was observed about 8:30 p. m., passing back and forth across the harbor entrance. Suspicious of the coast guardsmen were aroused, and when search-light signals were observed from a shore point, the guards decided to investigate.

A. E. Holst, in charge of the coast guard here, instructed several of his men to search for the shore contact point, while he and four others sped after the troller in a power boat.

Captain Olson was the only man on board the troller. He surrendered at once.

The Main has been engaged in troling operations on the Oregon and Washington coast for several years.

Coast guard officers believe the troller picked up her liquor cargo from a larger ship beyond the 12-mile limit.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 28. (AP)—Will H. Hays, czar of moviedom, and former postmaster general, was married yesterday to Mrs. Jessie Herron Stutesman, widow of a former American minister to Bolivia.

The marriage took place at Bethesda, Maryland, home of the bride's brother, Colonel Chas. D. Herron. Mrs. Hays is the daughter of Mrs. William Parke Harron of Crawfordsville, Ind.

Her first husband was James F. Stutesman, also an Indian, who died in 1913. She has made her home with her mother in Crawfordsville and with a brother, Major Frederick Herron, in New York.

The wedding, a quiet ceremony, was attended only by relatives of the two. Rev. A. J. McCartney, pastor of the Covenant First Presbyterian church in Washington, performed the rite.

SULLIVAN, Ind., Nov. 28. (AP)—Will H. Hays obtained a divorce June 20, last, in his home town from the former Helen Louise Thomas, daughter of Judge A. B. Thomas of Crawfordsville, Ind.

They were married in 1902, and had separated several years before the divorce, which was on the ground of incompatibility. Hays was given the custody of a 15-year-old son.

Jury Reports On Death of Sutherland

EUGENE, Nov. 28. (AP)—The coroner's jury, declaring that Ray Sutherland, Maroon slayer, who was killed in his hideout in the mountains near Westfir Tuesday, "met death by gunshot wounds fired by a sheriff's posse," closes the case upon which Lane county officers have concentrated since August 23, when two peace officers were slain during a raid on the Sutherland place.

That Ray Sutherland's gunfire on the posse which killed him was prepared in advance and that he fired the first shot, that he was ordered to surrender before he was shot, that he answered with gunfire, and that officers were instructed to take him alive if possible were points brought out in the inquest.

Ten witnesses, including the posse which killed Sutherland, a doctor who examined the body, the sheriff, and a man formerly acquainted with Sutherland, were called before the jury.
