

Feeding Lambs Is Big Industry on McKendree Farm

There is thriving on the 500-acre ranch of Scott McKendree, four miles north of Merrill, an industry which holds more possibilities for profitably utilizing the surplus hay and grain produced in Klamath county than all of the legislation that can come out of congress in the next 20 years. It is that of feeding hay and wheat for finishing from 6,500 to 10,000 head of lambs for the market in San Francisco and other coast points during a period of four months in the year when fat lambs are not coming in from the range.

McKendree is at present feeding seven tons of hay and from 50 to 60 sacks of grain daily to the 5500 head of lambs which are being fed at the pens on his ranch, an industry in which he has been engaged for a sufficient period of time to demonstrate that it is not only profitable to him, but one which is requiring considerably more hay and grain than his productive farm is able to supply.

Markets 6500 Head
McKendree's operations extend over a period of four months, during which he will have used over 500 tons of hay and approximately 7000 sacks, or considerably more than 15,000 bushels of grain, and will have marketed a total of 6500 head of finished lambs.

Lambs are placed in the feeding pens during the early part of October and final shipments are made not later than early February, which makes a feeding season of approximately 120 days.

As in all activities where financial success is attained, preparing lambs for market on a scale as extensive as that on the McKendree farm is a business in itself and one which requires a small outlay of capital in the construction of pens and feeding grounds. Although shipments of finished lambs from there this season will total 6500 head, the plant is capable of handling 10,000 head, and has been constructed along lines which will permit feeding of that vast number of lambs with a minimum of effort and affording facilities which will produce a maximum increase in weight during the shortest possible time.

The pens have been erected on sloping ground, insuring perfect drainage. An underground water system has been installed, which is fed from a well through an automatic pressure pump. No storage tank is used, only an air-chamber, and the flow to the troughs is regulated by floats which not only permit the water to flow direct from the pump but maintain a uniform water level in each of the troughs. The water pumped from the 500-foot well is exceptionally warm and the direct flow from the pump to the troughs, made possible only without the use of a storage tank, and the installation of the float control system means that the lambs are supplied with warm water for drinking purposes during the coldest season, which, according to Mr. McKendree is essential in fattening lambs.

Feeding Methods
There are 12 pens in the yards, six on each side of a central lane. Troughs from which the grain is fed are located in the lane separating the two rows of pens, while racks for hay are located in the pens. Feeding is done on a rigid schedule. Grain is placed in the troughs in the lane and while the lambs are at the grain troughs wagons loaded with hay pull into the pens and the racks are filled. Having consumed the feed of grain, the lambs return of their accord to the pens and the gates leading to the lane are closed. Only half of the lambs, or those of the pens on one side of the lane, are fed grain at a time, which requires only half the number of grain troughs.

McKendree, who has made a careful study of feeding lambs and who has a record of methods employed and results obtained in various states, reports that the rough hay and unchopped grain of Klamath county produce equal results in added weight to those obtained in districts where processed feeds are used, such as chopped hay and ground grain. He points out that this is not only a saving in cost, but says that it is due to the excellent quality of hay and grain grown in this district, and to the fact that the type of lambs produced in this district readily take on added weight.

McKendree is feeding about one and one-fourths pounds of grain and three pounds of hay per head daily. The only variations in the amount of feed used occur with changing weather conditions, but the general average is represented in the figures quoted.

Coarser Types Fatten Easily
Discussing the breeds which are easier fattened for market, McKendree says that the coarser type, such as Blackface and Corriedales are, according to his experience, the better types for conditioning for market. He has also learned that lambs coming from fine wool breeds which have been crossed the Blackface and Corriedale breeds

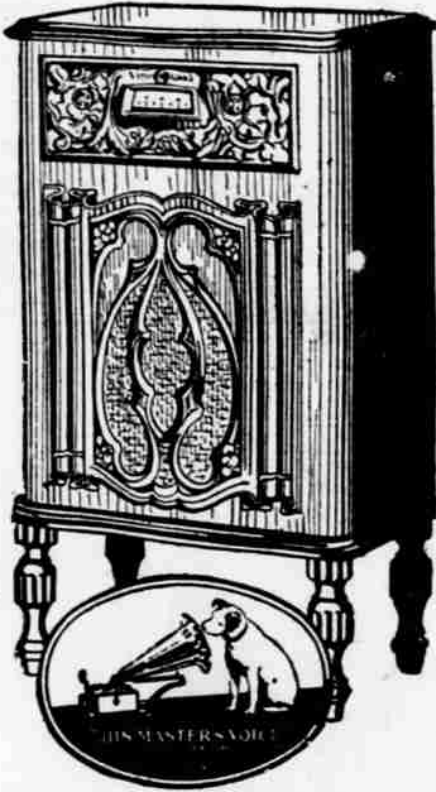

DENVER WOMAN PUT ON TRIAL

DENVER, Nov. 28. (AP)—The trial of Mrs. Pearl O'Loughlin, charged with the murder of her step-daughter, Leona, was

started today, after Judge Henley A. Calvert had over-ruled a defense motion for a three-day continuance.

Mrs. O'Loughlin, attired in a tight-fitting black hat and black silk dress with a cape effect across her shoulders, chatted with animation as her attorneys conferred. She looked considerably improved, and perhaps was more composed than at any time since her arrest.

The doctor who examined her announced that Mrs. O'Loughlin showed no evidence of disease.

The state had introduced 29 witnesses, among them Leo O'Loughlin, city detective and husband of the defendant. Mrs. O'Loughlin pleaded not guilty recently when arraigned.

The O'Loughlin girl's body was found October 17, three days after the child's disappearance from home, floating in a Berkeley Park lake. Ground glass was discovered in the viscera, and an examination of the contents of the

stomach of the child's father, ill in a hospital, also revealed ground glass.

The police investigation as far as has been made public, has resulted in evidence wholly of circumstantial nature.
