

# STRIBLING IS WINNER OVER CHICAGO LAD

CHICAGO, Dec. 12 (AP)—W. L. "Young" Stribling of Macon, Ga., has completed his conquest of the Chicago heavyweight field by a decisive 15-round victory over "Tuffy" Griffiths, the tough youth from St. Louis, Mo. As a result he may be recognized by the National Boxing Association, at least, as the champion of the world.

The flistic pride of the south, a 2 to 1 favorite before the battle in the Chicago stadium last night, left no doubt as to his superiority but not without calling upon all the ringcraft gained in more than 200 fights. He won the unanimous decision of Referee Purdy and the judges over the best Griffiths Chicago ever saw.

Stribling was favored to win by a knockout, probably because of his sensational one-round elimination of Otto Von Porat in the same ring several months ago, and he made at least one desperate bid to stop the St. Louis City youngster. Griffiths, however, fought a clever defensive fight and his left hand, while it inflicted little damage, ruined many of Stribling's maneuvers.

The bout drew a somewhat disappointing crowd of 15,570 spectators who gave up \$85,257.16. Just before it Major General John V. Clinan, president of the national boxing commission, announced he had recommended the N. B. A. recognize the winner as champion of the world, as Max Schmeling had failed to defend the title within six months of winning it. However, the recommendation must be approved by each member state in the N. B. A.

## Extra Point No Test of Strength

There has been considerable agitation in football circles to abolish the extra point after the touchdown. Many claim it has no part in the modern game and that contests that are decided by one point do not settle the superiority of teams.

There has been some talk about eliminating the sacrifice fly from baseball.

The point after touchdown and the sacrifice fly are similar in some respects. Neither is a true test of superiority.

The batter, with a runner on third base is trying to make a base hit if possible and NOT trying to hit a long fly to the outfield.

Many times, a player who has taken no part in a football game until after the touchdown is scored, is called out to boot the extra point over the bar.

The point after touchdowns and the sacrifice fly are both purely technicalities that could easily be done without in both games.

## Sacrifice Fly Now A Thing Of The Past

NEW YORK, Dec. 12, (AP)—Goodbye to the sacrifice fly. Batsmen who lift long flies to the outfield on which base runners can advance a base will not be credited with a sacrifice hereafter and will be charged with a time at bat.

The joint rules committee of the major league has so decided.

Another change limits a batsman to two bases on all balls which bounce off the playing field. This was aimed to halt the epidemic of trick home runs made when the ball bounced off the playing fields into the stands.

The American league approved the National league rule by which balls are judged fair or foul where they leave the playing field and not where they are last seen.

# BATTALINO IS FIGHT WINNER

NEW YORK, Dec. 12 (AP)—Some thousands of fight fans were wondering today whether Bat Battalino, Hartford's favorite fighting son, has been vastly underrated as champion or whether "all through" should be written on the long record of the young Cuban negro, Kid Chocolate.

Battalino, whose performances had failed to impress the fight faithful, made a highly successful defense of his featherweight title in last night's battle before 17,000 Christmas fund contributors at Madison Square Garden. Yet after watching him pound the Cuban's body for 15 rounds of relentless attacking to win the unanimous decision of the referee and two judges, the fans still were not sure whether it was Bat's strength or the "kidd's" weakness that brought the result.

The slim Cuban negro started the fans in the very first round when he sent the champion down for a count of nine, but did not hurt him.

From that minute it was all Battalino. Boring in, his arms wrapped around his head, taking Chocolate's blows on his elbows and firing with both hands to the body whenever he got within range, the champion seemed to grow stronger as the fight went on. A great rally toward the end which won him the eleventh, twelfth, thirteenth and fourteenth rounds, turned the tide in his favor. The Associated Press score card gave Battalino eight rounds and Chocolate seven.

## Flouring Mill Is Burned at Turner

TURNER, Ore., Dec. 12, (AP)—Fire completely destroyed the pioneer mill and warehouse of the Turner Feed and Grain company early Saturday morning, with an estimated loss of \$50,000. Heat from the structure was so intense that windows in stores across the block were cracked. The Salem fire department and pumper responded, but were unable to do more than prevent the spread of the fire, wind carrying sparks to the business district, which for a time was threatened.
