PORTLAND, Dec. 12. (AP)—A 5-cent drop in quotations for fresh extra grade eggs was a sensation in Portland wholesale—and retail as well—markets today. Leading dealers and distant. Eggs are clogged to a critical point. Standard, medium and pullet eggs were cut 3, 4 and 4 cents respectively. Many producers are said to face extinction from the poultry field if consumers don't buy more eggs. The new wholesale quotations are: Extra, 20c; standards, 15c; mediums, 15c, and pullets, 15c. Fresh extras are retailing at 25 cents or less a dozen. Wholesale butter market was steady at unchanged prices. Both receipts and demand were a bit lighter. Livestock: Receipts, Hogs, 55, direct; cattle 25, sheep 120, direct. Week's approximate totals: Hogs 4425, cattle 2540, calves 235, sheep 3655. HOGS: Compared week ago, slaughtering classes 25c higher; feeders steady; bulk and practical top light butchers, \$9.50; over and underweight, \$9.35; down; heaviest down to \$8.00 and below; rough packing sows, \$6.50-7.00; bulk feeder pigs, \$9.00-9.50. CATTLE: Compared week ago, Steers, 25 to 50c higher, mostly steady; medium to good heifers steady, mostly \$7.55-8.75, to \$9.00 for one load; others \$7.75 down to \$6.50 and under; fairly good heifers, \$7.00-7.75, and good cows \$6.00-6.50 with bulk desirable stock \$5.25 up; low cutters and cullers, \$2.50-4.50; good bulls mostly \$4.50-5.00; few Monday \$5.50, strictly choice vealers quoted up to \$11.00, but bulk of calves and vealers \$11.00 down from \$10.00 down with off grades to \$4.50. SHEEP: Steady with week ago. A few good to strictly choice lambs \$11.00. Bulk desirable cars \$6.00-6.50 with throw-outs \$5.50 down to \$4.50.
