

DEATH VALLEY IS COMBED FOR MISSING MAN

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 15. (A.P.)—Searchers combed Death Valley for traces of Ralph G. Farnum, New York theatrical booking agent missing since early in November, were organizing an airplane searching party today to augment groups trekking on foot.

A close friend of the missing New York theatrical man, who gave his name as Leo Morrison, said he expected to charter a plane here, fly to Baker's landing field in Death Valley and skim low over valley trails to locate Farnum.

The search for the New Yorker, who is 40 years old and came from New York in November with his wife, the former Mabelle Griffith of Baltimore for a vacation in California, extended to Los Angeles yesterday, in a last hope that the valley had not claimed Farnum as a victim.

Mrs. Farnum, it is understood, accompanied her husband part way to California. He is believed to have visited Death Valley for the benefit of his health.

Friends of Farnum held out a rosiest hope today that the theatrical agent might have reached the famed abode of Death Valley Scotty, host of valley wayfarers, where he would be hospitably cared for.

The fear predated among veteran desert trackers at Death Valley Junction, however, that the blistering bottoms of the valley had claimed in Farnum another human, to add to its gruesome collection of bleached bones.
