

ANNUAL SCOUT MEETING HELD WEDNESDAY EVE

In addressing those present at the annual meeting of the Klamath Area Council, Boy Scouts of America, held at Hotel Willard last night, W. L. Hayward, associate regional executive, stressed the importance of the Scout movement as a community asset.

Hayward stated that scouting is more than recreation, more than an out-of-doors movement. It is a service movement. Its boys are recognized and accepted everywhere. Every activity, every test, every new building proposed on a camp site, every new policy of administration of the council should first be submitted to the test of how will it affect the boy.

Boys Important

"The boy is the hub about which the entire movement must revolve," the associate executive concluded. "Any program for boys must be full of interest. It must be stimulating, health-giving and build organic vigor. Because of the present existing conditions, boys are confronted with new contacts and new forces. If they are to stand up under the increased pressure of present-day life they must be built physically strong, mentally awake and morally straight."

"The Scout troop is often the first contact for a boy into the social institution of his race. In the self-organizing activities of his troop and patrol, scouting may do what the school does not accomplish, that is, to help a boy decide what he wants to be."

Compliments Leaders

"The present need is leadership, men willing to give of their time in serving the boys of their communities, to understand their characters with the old-fashioned virtues and to train them to carry the application of these virtues over into the very complicated social, civic and economical life of which they are a part. No other task is comparable in its fundamental importance and far reaching effect upon America's future. It is a privilege to have a part in leading boys. To build something real, if sometimes of intangible value, to the world."

The speaker paid a high compliment to the volunteer leaders and to all of those who are giving so unselfishly of their time in the service to boyhood.

Re-Elect Officers

The present officers of the council, W. E. Lamm, president; Jack Kimball, vice-president; and J. A. Gordon, treasurer, were re-elected.

The annual activities for the Scouts in the past year included: Patroling hills for two weeks while coating was good, canvassed city during "clean-up week" for the Garden Club; collected old toys to be repaired for poor children at Christmas; held first-aid contest; put in window displays; held rally in American Legion hall; attended the Fort Klamath ski races; held a treasure hunt; participated in the Memorial Day parade; held Camp-o-Rat and Court of Honor at high school; attended summer camp, now making plans for winter camp.

Total Court of Honor awards for 1930 were 423.

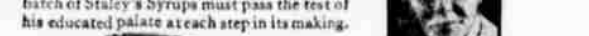
