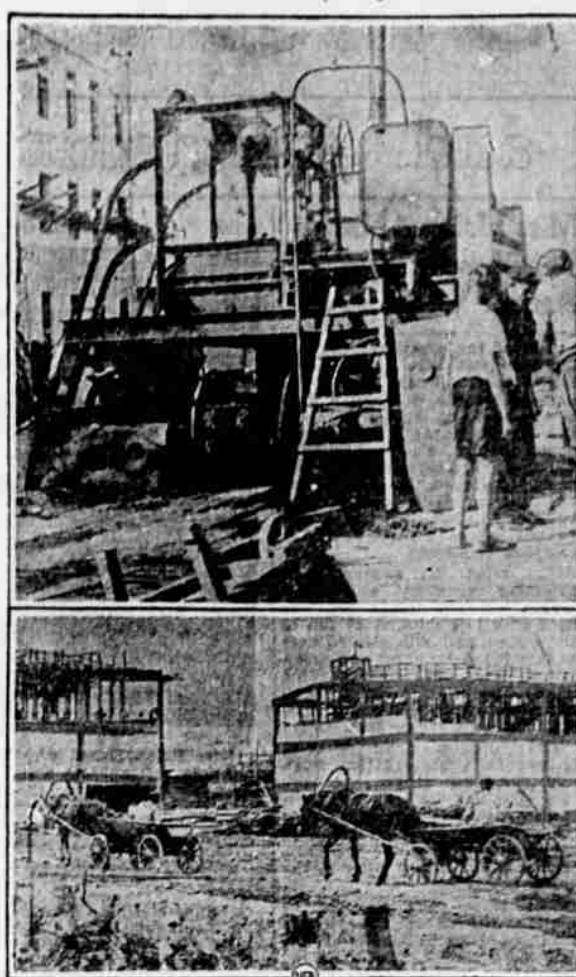

LONDON, Dec. 17. (UP)—London was as dark as night for hours today when the city experienced a "complete blackout," which was officially said to be due to "a smoke pall." Officials said the smoke pall was held down by a layer of warmer air which prevented the cold air from rising. The area of darkness apparently was confined to the London region, as the horse race at Windsor was run in brilliant sunshine. Windsor is 25 miles from London.
