State Commission Delays Action On Power Application

SALEM, Jan. 8, (AP)—Retaliation of the state reclamation commission to take action in connection with the application of the Northwest Power company to appropriate the waters of Marion Lake and the North Santiam rivers, until after the 1931 legislature, was announced yesterday at a special session of the commission.

These applications were filed several years ago, and two public hearings have been held in Salem within the past 18 months. The company proposed to use the water for power purposes.

Contract for Tires Is Awarded by State

SALEM, Jan. 8, (AP)—Contract to supply the tires used on motorized equipment of the state this year was again let to the U. S. Rubber company by the board of control yesterday. Under the new contract, which the board characterized as very good, Oregon will buy its tires at 60 percent off wholesale dealers' prices with a discount of 55 percent on wholesale prices of casing.

The state spent about \$45,000 for tires and tubes under the 1930 contract.

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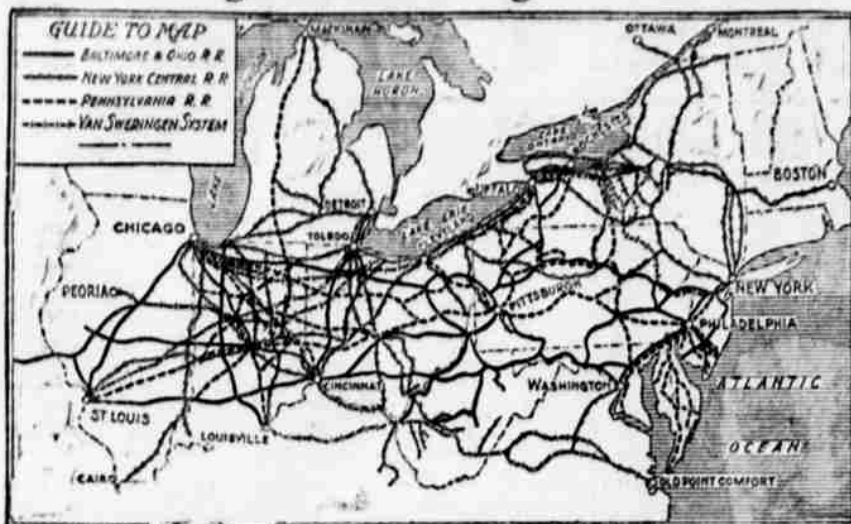
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How Big Railroads Merged Lines in East



The plan for merging the eastern railways into four great systems is illustrated by this map. President Hoover initiated the pro-consolidation conferences between the four major groups—the Pennsylvania, the New York Central, the Baltimore & Ohio, and the Chesapeake & Ohio, which, with the Nickel Plate, comprise the Van Sweringen system. Under the agreement, the Lackawanna goes to the New York Central; the Baltimore & Ohio goes to the Reading; and the Lehigh Valley and possibly the Pittsburgh & West Virginia and the Western will be added to the Van Sweringen line.

Leaders Fail In Plans To Delay Report

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8, (AP)—A last minute effort by congressional leaders anxious to avoid an extra session of the new congress to postpone the submission of the law enforcement commission's report has failed.

The attitude of the congressional chieftains was laid before the commission yesterday, but the insurgent wing, led by Judge William S. Kenyon of Iowa, objected to further delay. This same group over-rode Chairman Wickham of the commission last fall, and forced the body to face the prohibition issue immediately.

The commission is ready to make its long awaited prohibition report. President Hoover has taken the position he can not hold up the report, and he is prepared to transmit it to congress.

WARSAW.—Compulsory military service for women is expected to be established here as the result of action by women members of Parliament.

The scheme provides for the formation of a special women's army, in which girls will be required to serve when they attain the age of 18. In the event of war they will form a special reserve.

Clear Skies Follow Rains In California

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 8, (AP)

Clear skies and cool temperatures were promised California today and tomorrow by official forecasters following fresh rains which brought the total precipitation a little closer to normal.

Aside from damage along the Ventura and Long Beach waterfronts by pounding seas, the latest outburst of the elements brought nothing but benefit to the state.

Snow on the mountains and rain elsewhere was general over the state.

Beginning in the late afternoon rain poured down on Los Angeles until it reached cloud burst proportions. At the peak, half an inch was recorded in half an hour. The fall was heavier in Pasadena, while precipitation was generous over the entire southern coastal section.

PASSING OF JUDGE CAUSES SPECULATION

PORTLAND, Jan. 8, (AP)—Although the situation is not openly discussed, out of respect for the memory of the late jurist, there is much speculation here as to who will be selected to succeed Federal Judge Robert S. Bean who died yesterday.

Upon his death it was learned that the condition of his health had for some time past been a matter of considerable concern to his family, and that he had written Senators McNary and Steiwer last month that he would retire as soon as they and President Hoover could agree upon his successor. Judge Bean expressed the hope he might retire from judicial work before March 1.

From this it is taken that Senators McNary and Steiwer have already given the matter some consideration.

A great many names were being discussed here, but the discussion held no particular significance, as practically every possible candidate was mentioned.

It was believed, too, that Judge Bean's sudden death may have some bearing on the selection of a successor to Federal Circuit Judge Dietrich who died in Boise last September, shortly after he, with the Portland federal bench, had heard the cross-state railroad case. Judge Bean died a short time after the second hearing of this case, called because of the death of Judge Dietrich.

Now, it is believed, a third hearing will be necessary, as no decision had been handed down when Judge Bean died.

Dense Fog Holds Hundred Ships in English Harbors

LONDON, Jan. 8, (AP)—One hundred ships from all parts of the world were held in British ports today by a heavy fog.

The Mersey was shrouded and many boats anchored there feared to move. The Ansonia, which should have landed New York passengers at Liverpool Tuesday, tried again yesterday but was compelled to anchor outside.

The first passenger boat from Belfast since Sunday succeeded during the night in getting away from Liverpool harbor, which was crowded with boats which left Dublin and Belfast Monday night. At Manchester a fog of intensity unknown for a generation has persisted for five days.

Bronchitis and pneumonia have accounted for many deaths, and traffic on land has been greatly impeded. There have been many accidents and injuries.

CORN IS MADE TRADE LEADER IN GRAIN PIT

CHICAGO, Jan. 8, (AP)—Corn has formally been recognized as grain trade leader, displacing wheat. Notice was given today on the board of trade that beginning next Monday wheat business will be transferred to the pit heretofore used for corn.

The largest trading pit on the exchange floor, the old wheat pit, will be occupied by brokers dealing in corn. The smaller pit formerly used for corn transactions now is much more than ample for the wheat crowd, which was dwindled in size since transactions have been confined chiefly to government-sponsored agencies.

Corn is free from so-called stabilization measures under government auspices, and has of late shown decidedly greater activity than wheat.
