

WET DECISION BEFORE HIGH COURT TODAY

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21, (AP)—The Clark decision holding the Eighteenth amendment invalid was put to rest today in the supreme court.

Chief Justice Hughes withdrew from the case, announcing he submitted a brief to the court when prohibition was before it in 1920, and thus considered himself disqualified.

The decision of Federal Judge William Clark of New Jersey, was based on a contention that the amendment to be valid should have been ratified by state conventions rather than by state legislatures.

After brief preliminaries, Solicitor General Thacher launched into the government's argument.

He said it seemed clear that Article V. of the Constitution had conferred ample authority upon congress for its determination to refer the amendment to state legislatures.

He added the article was a mandate upon congress and left it free to use its own judgment in determining whether the prohibition amendment should be referred to state legislatures or conventions.

The solicitor general then reviewed the decisions of the supreme court since 1824 to sustain his contention.

He insisted congress was at liberty to determine in all cases whether a proposed constitutional amendment should be submitted to state legislatures or state conventions for ratification.

The decision of the supreme court in the national prohibition case determined the question raised by Judge Clark's decision, he continued.

In closing Thacher said: "This attack against the Eighteenth amendment falls utterly and completely to the ground because based upon a fundamental misconception of the character of the government which had been created by the constitution."

Solicitor General Thacher took only a half hour in presenting the government's appeal, although allowed two hours.

Major Leagues Win From Minors Over Universal Draft

NEW YORK, Jan. 21, (AP)—Baseball's battle over the universal draft is ended and the spoils of war belong to the major leagues.

The minor league's defenses, slowly crumbling for several weeks, collapsed yesterday when the last class AA stronghold, the International league, voted to accept the Major's demands.

The International league, where some of the most violent anti-draft sentiment was manifested, was forced to yield to a superior force. Its four allies, the class AA American association and Pacific Coast league, the class A western league and the class B three-eye league previously had capitulated to the Major's and left the International to fight the good fight alone.

Six Are Killed As Quake Strikes Java

BATAVIA, Java, Jan. 21, (A)—Six persons were killed and a number injured when an earthquake knocked down the chimneys of a tobacco factory at Projeck, Central Java village. The earthquake also did considerable damage at another village, Homajoe. There were seven severe shocks.
