where she was receiving medical attention was able to return to her home Thursday.

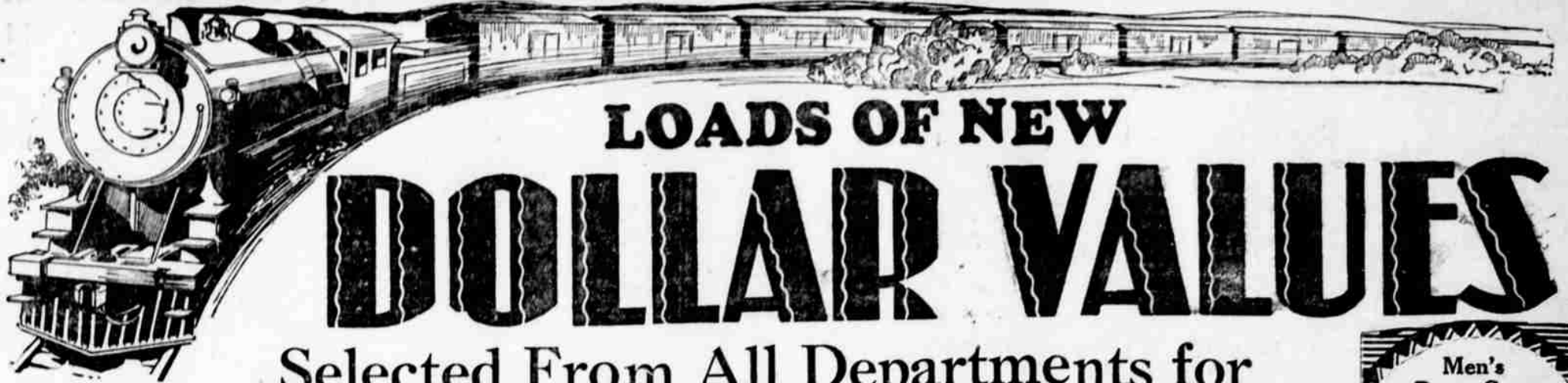
## Padgett's Guests Here—
