

TWO BAD MEN ESCAPE FROM STATE PRISON

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 30. (AP)—An all-night search by a crew of thirty men failed to capture two convicts who made their break for liberty last night from the state penitentiary. Early today prison officials had no word or clue as to the whereabouts of the pair. A dense fog aided in their getaway.

Lee Duncan, sentenced from Douglas county in 1925, to serve 35 years for assault upon an officer, and Dan Flynn, sentenced from Multnomah county to 15 years for assault, broke into the flat mill, secured a ladder and climbed over the wall under cover of the fog. They turned out the lights along the wall, and were gone perhaps five minutes before their absence was detected by the lack of lights, officials said. They had been working in the boiler shop.

Shortly after making their escape two men robbed the clothes line of Otto Mueller in Salem and secured a brown overcoat and other clothes. Mueller was knocked down by one of the men when he went to investigate the noise in his yard.

The prison break was the first since 1925. Warden Jim Lewis termed the two as "bad boys." Duncan was serving his second term in the penitentiary, and before being brought to Salem he had escaped from the Douglas county jail.

Deputy Warden C. C. Hawley gave out the following description of the two convicts: Lee Duncan, 26, fair complexion, blue-gray eyes, light brown hair, weight 155 pounds, height five feet seven inches, medium build. Dan Flynn, also 26, light complexion, blue eyes, blond hair, weight 150 pounds, height five feet nine inches, and medium build. A \$50 reward is offered for the capture of each.

Lee Duncan, one of the two prisoners who escaped last night from the state prison, was today characterized as "a bad man" by ex-Sheriff Sam A. Starmer of Douglas county. Starmer, who is superintendent of the state soldiers' home at Roseburg, is a spectator at the legislature.

"Duncan was arrested in Roseburg for five burglaries," Starmer said. "While in jail he broke up a heavy coffee cup and made a 'sap' by putting the pieces in a sock. With this he attacked the jailer and made his escape. He was captured five days later near Roseburg and was given a sentence of five years on each of the burglary charges and 10 years for the assault on the officer, making a total of 35 years.

"Duncan's method of burglary is to let himself through a skylight by means of a rope, and

he leaves the building the same way."

PORTLAND, Jan. 30. (AP)—State officers and Portland police were today searching this city for Lee Duncan and Dan Flynn, who escaped last night from Oregon state prison.

E. S. Worden and Ben Edwards, prison employees, were directing the search for the convicts here. They are believed to have come to this city as Flynn has friends here.

NEW FUNERAL HOME OPENED

Windsor chairs will be used in the chapel room, adding to the effect of quiet, soft colors, while the family room is comfortably furnished with upholstered chairs and couches.

The second story of the residence will be used for showrooms and the preparation room.

Landscapeing of the yard about the funeral home will start this spring, and the owners, F. O. Parker and Horace C. McGinnis, announced that they will probably hold a formal opening of the establishment later in the spring.

Both Mr. McGinnis and Mr. Parker are experienced in this work. Mr. McGinnis having been located in this city for the past several years, and Mr. Parker has been affiliated with a funeral home in Corvallis. They are both graduates of the Los Angeles Embalming school.
