

Reduced Freight Rate Prevails on Local Products

Rates on Potatoes, Hay and Grain from Klamath Points to San Francisco Reduced From One To Three Cents

Reduction of freight rates by the Southern Pacific Railroad company on agricultural commodities shipped from Klamath valley to San Francisco, have been announced by the transportation and freight rates committee of the chamber of commerce.

The rates on potatoes, hay and grain have been reduced from 1 to 3 cents from points along the Modoc Northern route, including Stukel, Merrill, Malone, Tule Lake, Stronghold and Perez. The rates from Klamath Falls will remain the same.

Effective Soon
The rate reduction on potatoes will be effective February 4. The new rates on hay were effective January 21, and the grain rates will be effective February 23.

EXPERIMENTER IN AIRPLANES DIES IN CRASH
CHICAGO, Feb. 2, (AP)—The prediction of some of the acquaintances of Edward Heath, 45, a pioneer in airplane experimentation, that he some day would kill himself came true yesterday. He died in a plunge from an altitude of about 200 feet while flying in a new plane of his own design near Morton Grove, a suburb.

Heath, who was widely known as a stunt flier, and as the designer and manufacturer of the Heath parashut plane, had long been interested in aviation experiments.

ARGENTINE HAS NO MERCY FOR GANG LEADERS

BUENOS AIRES, Feb. 2, (AP)—Summary justice was death today to Paulino Scarfo, lieutenant of the Argentine's executed gangster king and confessed co-author of the bomb attempt against the branch of the First National Bank of Boston in 1927.

Scarfo, who yesterday called out "viva la anarquia" as the shots ending the life of his chief, Severino Di Giovanni, rang out, was put before a firing squad today.

Scarfo, one of Buenos Aires' leading anarchists, was arrested Friday after a raid on his apartment in which a policeman and two gangsters were killed. He was tried immediately for murder and sentenced to execution.

His chief, Di Giovanni, was arrested Thursday after a street fight in which a 13-year-old girl was killed. Their activities were similar to gangster activities in the United States.

Yesterday at dawn they took Di Giovanni out of his cell, clamped heavy shackles about his legs and led him into the patio to the execution chair. A firing squad stood a few yards away.

They would not let him say goodbye to Scarfo nor would anyone take a statement from him.

It was a slow walk from the cell to the chair and Di Giovanni, with three days beard and rough prison clothes was a sharp contrast to the well-groomed gangster who had become a terror to the countryside.

They strapped him in the chair and he faced his executioners with open eyes. The rifles barked and he slumped down. An officer administered the coup de grace, sending a revolver bullet into his head.

As the shots sounded across the morning, cries of "viva la anarquia" rang from the nearby prison.

KELLEMS WIN MANY JOINERS
The greatest day of Kellems Brothers' meetings was enjoyed yesterday at the First Christian church. There were fifteen additions to the church during the day, making 77 for the meeting thus far. The crowds packed the building at all services.

Tonight Dr. Kellems will preach on the subject "Why I am a Christian Only." This sermon was published in America, Australia and England as a tract and has been used by the churches of Christ everywhere.

It is one of the most interesting delivered by Dr. Kellems.

In preaching last night on the theme, "The Unpardonable Sin," Dr. Kellems said in part, "I could not for a moment think that a sin to be so dreadful as the New Testament depicts this one could be simply a word. Some there are who think this. The unpardonable sin is to attribute the works of Jesus to the power of the Devil. But so many men speak an unguarded word for which they are sorry in a moment. Knowing the Master as we do we are certain that He is more loving and more forgiving than this. This sin is an act, a state of soul brought on by a repetition of certain acts. It is the sin of spiritual suicide. That man who incapacitates himself to function in the great way of salvation has committed the unpardonable sin. He has closed his eyes, stopped his ears and hardened his heart. It is therefore a sin against light and truth."

At the close of the meeting a number of men and women and two little children were baptized.

There will be baptismal services again tonight.

OIL MAN IS KILLED AS AIRPLANE CRASHES
VERNON, Texas, Feb. 2, (AP)—Sam Penny, Chickasha, Okla., oil man, is dead from injuries suffered in the crash of an airplane in a dead-end landing here yesterday. Carl D. Winstead of Wichita, Kan., the pilot, was in a serious condition today in a Vernon hospital. Airport attaches said the plane side-slipped 100 feet above the ground.

ELDERLY CHINESE USES KNIFE IN SUICIDE
BAKER, Ore., Feb. 2, (AP)—Hong Young, elderly Chinese of Baker, stabbed himself to death in the Chinese quarter here yesterday. He used a ten-inch knife which penetrated the body below the breast bone. Young died 40 minutes later. More than \$300 was found in his pocket. He had tried to kill himself 18 months ago, police said, by slashing his throat.

BEAVERTON PIONEER DIES
SPOKANE, Wash., Feb. 2, (AP)—William Henry Warren, 75, who settled near Beaverton, Ore., 45 years ago, died at a hospital here yesterday. He had lived here for the past six months.
