Epidemic Spinal Meningitis Rages Throughout China

SHANGHAI, Feb. 13, (AP)—Kuo Min, news agency of the national government said today a spinal meningitis epidemic was "raging" in Chekiang province. A Hanchow dispatch said that out of 812 cases at Haining, 75 miles southwest of Shanghai, 610 died. Provincial authorities were said to be responding to "widespread urgent calls from various areas asking help."

Foreign health authorities here issued a warning urging the adoption of preventive measures locally.
