

GOES INSANE WHILE RIDING IN AIRPLANE

DETROIT, Feb. 13 (AP)—A man who endangered the lives of two fellow passengers and the pilot of a Chicago-Detroit airplane yesterday was under observation in the psychopathic ward of Irving hospital today.

He is James J. Mangan, advertising manager for a Chicago novelty company. The reason for his strange actions has not been determined by hospital officials, but one of the physicians said last night they might have been a manifestation of air sickness.

Louis Steward, of Plano, Ill., the pilot, said Mangan leaped from his seat, shouting at the top of his voice, when the plane was over South Bend, Ind., and tried several times to climb into the control room of the plane,

shouting that he wanted "to help you run this plane."

Then, Steward said, "he would run back and forth in the plane once in a while opening the door and throwing out money."

The other passengers were terrified, the pilot said.

By fighting Mangan off with one hand while he attempted to enter the control room, Steward brought the plane safely to land at city airport. There, four policemen removed Mangan from the ship and took him to the hospital.

At the hospital Mangan's age was given as about 35.

Improper License Plates Results In Charge of Larceny

Charges of larceny of an automobile will be filed today against C. F. Robinson, who holds the questionable distinction of being hauled into jail twice in 24 hours.

Robinson is alleged to have stolen a new Ford sedan from in front of the Balsiger warehouse about six months ago. The car had just been serviced and was ready to be placed on display in the garage show rooms. Robinson drove the automobile to Corvallis, where he is alleged to have stolen one license plate from a parked car.

With only one plate, the man has driven the pilfered auto 21,000 miles. Officers became suspicious when they saw the car on the streets of Klamath Falls with only one plate. After investigation, Robinson was arrested, and paid a fine of \$20 for improper license plates. Further investigation revealed the history of the car the man was driving.

Former Cashier of Chiloquin Bank To Get Penalty Today

Sentence will be imposed upon James Garland Nichols, charged with larceny by embezzlement of funds and assets in connection with the robbery of the Chiloquin State bank, at 4:30 this afternoon. Judge O. M. Corkins will pronounce sentence.

Henry E. Perkins, counsel for the youthful robber, made a stirring plea for leniency and parole in circuit court Tuesday. D. E. Van Vactor, deputy district attorney, in charge of prosecution, does not recommend parole.

D. B. "Penny" Stont, Nichols' partner in the "holdup" act, has asked for an extension of time in entering his plea to charges against him.

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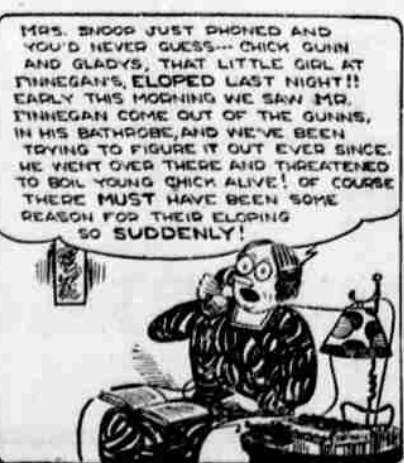
