

ARTIST IS STRANGLED TO DEATH

Diary of Victim, Vivian Gordon, May Lead to Slayers

THREATENED EXPOSE OF POLICE FRAMEUP

Her Lawyer, And Former Convict Are Detained for Questioning

NEW YORK, Feb. 27. (AP)—Named in her diary as persons she feared, her own lawyer and an ex-convict were held for questioning today in the strangling of Vivian Gordon.

Feared Her Lawyer—John A. Rabeloff, a Brooklyn attorney, and Sam Cohen, alias Charles Harris, were taken into custody yesterday and examined today as to their associations with her. A unnamed woman friend of Miss Gordon also was questioned and released.

One inscription in the diary, Police Commissioner Edward P. Mulrooney said, read as follows: "I fear but one man, and he is Rabeloff, my lawyer, who, if he wanted, could get Cohen and a couple of his henchmen to do away with me."

Rabeloff told the commissioner that Miss Gordon informed him several weeks ago that she had made an appointment to testify concerning alleged graft on the part of the vice squad and that he had advised her not to.

"I will, I'm going to give McLaughlin the needle," who was quoted by him as replying. Commissioner Mulrooney immediately sent for Patrolman Andrew B. McLaughlin, who arrested Miss Gordon on a charge of immorality in 1927, and was instrumental in sending her to Bedford reformatory, but discovered that he had left on a five-day vacation Monday, presumably for Bermuda.

Miss Gordon's body was found in Van Cortlandt Park yesterday with a length of a clothesline wound about her neck. It was six days after the date she failed to appear as a volunteer witness in the magistrates' courts inquiry.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 27. (AP)—Vivian Gordon, 32-year-old artist found strangled to death in New York yesterday, was Mrs. Benita Bischoff, the first wife of an Audubon, N. J., resident.

Early today New York detectives arrived at the home of her former husband, John C. Bischoff, a deputy United States marshal, now stationed in Washington, D.C.

After questioning Bischoff's second wife, Mrs. Eunice Bischoff, 32, the detectives left, taking with them a picture of the dead woman, who was killed after promising to reveal a "frame-up by police officers."

A search of the Bischoff's residence at Audubon, police said, revealed a letter written to Bischoff several weeks ago by his former wife. In the letter the woman accused him of "framing" her with a New York detective, authorities said.

The letter read in part: "Dear Mr. Bischoff: You have probably heard about the vice investigation now going on in New York City which is growing day by day, that a number of convicted girls framed by the police and others."

"You know that I am one of those girls and that my conviction was caused by a frame-up between you and Detective McLaughlin. You may think that you have had the last laugh but get this—I am going before the investigation committee this week and intend to tell the whole story of this dirty frame up."

"When I am through it will be just too bad for you . . . I intend to go the limit and you know as well as I do that this will mean your finish."
