Many bowlers have written me about the "back" ball and I am writing this type of ball, that I am writing an article on it.

When the ball is thrown it naturally turns to the right or left, depending upon what kind of "back" is put on it. It is to the left, it is a "back" ball and if it spins to the right it is a "back-up" ball.

To throw a back ball it is necessary to turn your hand at the instant the ball is released so that at that moment the palm of the hand is facing the floor. This is done with the "follow through" across the ball to reverse from right to left and produce a "back" ball, which is the ideal pin getter.

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Seals Have a New Million Dollar Park

SAN FRANCISCO, March 12. (AP)—Sales of the San Francisco Seals' new baseball park, built at a cost of \$1,100,000, swung open to fans for the first time today, despite the old superstition concerning Friday the 13th.

To the Detroit Tigers, of the American League, went the honor of opening the Seals in the informal opening of the park. The official dedication of the park will take place April 17, opening of the Pacific Coast League season.

The park is one of the largest and best equipped in the country. The right field fence is 384 feet from the home plate; center field is 450 feet; and left field is 468 feet.

The seating capacity is 25,000, with 12,000 of the seats of the grandstand 1790. The 5,000 bleacher seats will be in extreme right field. Lighting equipment of the most modern type was installed.

The most radical departure from the usual type of ball park is the Red Ball Stage Line.
