

PROPOSAL FOR HIGHER TAXES IS DISLIKED

WASHINGTON, April 6, (AP)—Factional leaders of congress looked with little favor today on the proposal by Senator Bingham that income taxes be increased and extended to curb governmental extravagance.

The Connecticut Republican no sooner had made his statement favoring the blanket increase in levies and an extension to smaller incomes than responsible members of both the senate and house objected.

Senator Watson of Indiana—the republican floor leader—said: "I am opposed to any further taxation because I don't think it is necessary under existing conditions."

Senator Norris of Nebraska, an independent republican leader, asserted that while he would not object to a hike if the expected \$700,000,000 deficit materialized, "the increase should be applied in inheritance taxes and on the higher brackets, or larger incomes."

Senator Harris of Georgia, ranking democrat on the senate appropriations committee, said: "I am opposed to Senator Bingham's plan in toto."

Representative LaGuardia of New York, a house independent leader, predicted there would be an increase, but added:

"There will be no lowering of the present tax exemption and that is just as certain as day follows night. The tax increases in the next congress will be such that Senator Bingham and his half dozen in the senate surely will vote against."

Bingham's proposal was the first in discussions of the approaching \$700,000,000 deficit to suggest tax demands be made on smaller incomes.

President Hoover believes an increase will not be necessary if congress restricts appropriations. Republican leader Tilson of the house thinks an increase is not now needed and should not become mandatory.

SALT LAKE CITY, April 6, (AP)—Senator Reed Smoot of Utah, chairman of the senate finance committee, said here yesterday that a prediction of increased taxation was the "widest kind of a guess."

He said that Senator Bingham's proposal for increasing income taxes and lowering exemptions was made inopportunely. He expressed his belief in the ability of the country to recover from the present financial difficulties without adding to its income.

Power of School Board Is Upheld By Atty. General

SALEM, April 6 (AP)—School boards have the power to proceed with the construction of a school building itself if it has rejected all bids, I. H. Van Winkle, attorney general, held in an opinion handed down today.

The question was raised by the Medford school district through C. A. Howard, state school superintendent. The attorney general stated that where a school board has in all respects complied with the statute by duly publishing notice of its intention to receive bids, and all bids submitted in accordance therewith have been rejected by the board, there is nothing to prevent the board from proceeding with the construction of the building itself providing no member of said board can be an interested party to the contract.

Names Capt. Root Governor of Guam

WASHINGTON, April 6, (AP)—Captain Edmund Spence Root of the navy, today was appointed Governor of Guam, succeeding Captain Willis W. Bradley. Captain Root's home address is at Portland, Ore.

"Tol'able David," the best story from the pen of the celebrated author, Joseph Hergeheimer, has been made into an all-talking film and is now playing at the New Vox Theatre where it will remain for four days. Joe Hergeheimer has the reputation of writing books of more than merely temporary significance.

"Tol'able David" is an excellent example of the truth of this statement. Judging from its popularity through the past years, it gives promise of remaining one of the classics.

Hergeheimer is an author of no mean ability. Like many other writers who have achieved fame in their second profession, Joseph Hergeheimer was originally determined to be a painter. It is because he possesses this talent that his writings possess that pictorial quality. His descriptions immediately paint a vivid picture for you—they can be likened to verbal canvases.

He was born in 1880 of a Pennsylvania Dutch family. At the age of 17 he entered the Philadelphia Academy of Fine Arts to study painting. His formal education up to this point had been very sketchy owing to his chronic ill-health. When he realized that he abandoned painting and embraced his new profession. For

14 years he wrote, frequently in a secluded spot in the Cumberland mountains where he derived his inspiration for "Tol'able David," a tale of back-mountain folk.

Before he actually sold a novel Hergeheimer during this period of apprenticeship in the Cumberland mountains, would rewrite a single story as many as 20 times before calling it finished. Among his best known works are "The Three Black Pennies," "Cythera," "Java Head" and "The Party Dress." His "west hasn't been published yet. It is called "The Limestone Tree." It is scheduled for publication sometime in 1931.

Due to the popularity of "Tol'able David," which was read by untold numbers of people, extraordinary care was exercised in choosing the cast. One hundred and seventy-two tests were made for a suitable actor to play the title role. He had to possess a certain combination of characteristics to portray the character as described by Hergeheimer. As a result of these tests, Richard Cromwell, an unknown was designated for the part. He is a handsome youngster with that charm and naivete that make him ideal. Others in the cast are Joan Peers, Noah Beery, Henry Watling, Edmond Breese and George Duryea.
