





MADRID, Oct. 14, 009-The centurities old influence of the Catholic church on the govern-ment of Spain was formally end-ed Tuesday when the constitu-lional assembly, laying the framework of the new republic, declared that "there is no state religion."

religion." Breaking away from the mon-archial practice of the past, the republican leaders rejected Cath-olicism as the official state re-ligion and hinted that the out-come of their policy would be the limmediate dissolution of least and other church organ-institutes and the nationalization of their property. The Catholic orders are accused of threaten-ing the security of the state. Although a foregone constitu-tion, the 277 to 41 vote of the assembly accepting the constitu-tional clauses on religion was an historic incident in a nation which has, in the past, been strongly influenced by the church.
