REDISTRICTING OF STATE DISCUSSED

SALEM, Oct. 17, (AP)—Proposals for a 16-team basketball tournament for Oregon were discussed at the meeting held here yesterday of the state high school athletic association in an endeavor to solve the question of re-districting the high schools of the state.

Two plans were suggested whereby an equal representation of the high schools of the state might be assured in the annual tournament in March. One was to divide the present ten districts which are represented by 12 teams into 16 districts with one team from each district, and with no division as to A and B

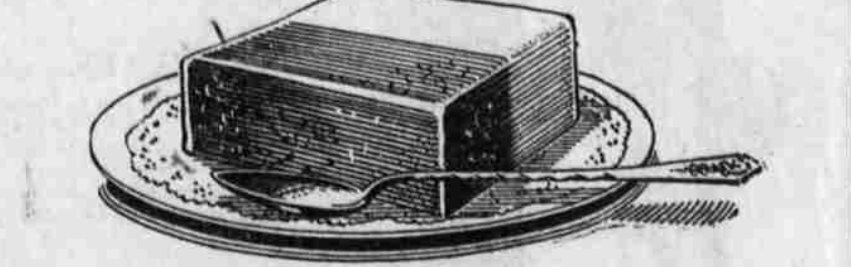
