SEVEN GOVERNORS TO ATTEND MEET

SALER, Oct. 20, (UP)—Governor Meier's office here today announced that governors of seven western states had accepted an invitation to attend the governor's conference in Portland, October 27, 28 and 29.

Those who have accepted the invitations include James Rolph, Jr., of California; Frederick B. Heizer of Nevada; C. Ben Ross of Idaho; Arthur Seligman of New Mexico; George H. Dern of Utah; A. M. Clark, acting governor of Wyoming, and Julius L. Meier of Oregon.

Four other western states will have representatives at the conference it was said. Discussions will include public lands, unemployment, highways, freight, farm relief, reclamation and taxation, national forests and the tariff.
