ATLANTA, Oct. 21, (UP)—Bishop James Cannon, Jr., of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, announced in a statement here tonight that, despite his indictment at Washington for alleged violation of the corrupt practices act, he will continue his "life-long work for social betterment."

At the same time he announced that "for the present" he had requested his colleague, Bishop John M. Moore of Dallas, Tex., and Bishop H. W. W. Darlington of Huntington, W. Va., to take general supervision of his work in Brazil and the Belgian Congo, respectively.

The bishop's statement was the first formal word to come from him since his indictment last Friday for failure to make legal report to congress of some \$65,500 expended under his direction in anti-Smith political activity in the presidential campaign of 1928.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21, (UP)—Frank discussion, probably without concrete agreements, will mark the visit here of Pierre Laval, president of the council of ministers of France, according to last minute governmental opinion today.

Laval will arrive in New York Thursday morning and in Washington Thursday afternoon for conversations with President Hoover and Secretary of State Bismarck.

Stories of plans have appeared frequently in connection with the visit, and predictions have been current as to agreements. But the main hope here is for plain talk that will lay the basis for agreements which may be reached in formal international conference later.

It is not thought in authoritative circles that there can be commitments on either side. Particularly as many nations are involved in all world problems.
