

STATE PATIENTS LESS THIS YEAR

HALEM, Ore., Nov. 13, (AP)—Commitments to the state hospitals for the insane, feeble-minded and tubercular patients have been slowed down due to an apparent misunderstanding of the so-called "ward" acts, which authorize the state to recover the cost of caring for such inmates, it was indicated here today by state officials.

There now is a decided reduction in the waiting list for admission to the three institutions, as compared to the waiting list of a year ago, according to Dr. G. C. Bellinger, superintendent of the tubercular hospital.

The waiting list at present for admission to the tubercular hospital is 80, as compared to a list of 70 a year ago. A similar situation at the feeble-minded home was noted when not a single answer was received to 18 notices issued to county courts, informing them that the institution was ready to take care of patients on the waiting list.

"County courts are still apparently laboring under the impression that they will be held responsible for the cost of caring for inmates committed to these institutions," Dr. Bellinger said.

Coast Lumber Trade Leading in Nation

TACOMA, Wash., Nov. 13, (UP)—Vital problems of the lumber industry were discussed here today by more than 100 representatives of large lumber mills along the Pacific coast, who met in the west coast lumbermen's conference.

"Lumber business on the coast is the best in the entire nation," was the statement of Col. W. H. Greeley, secretary-manager of the association. Figures presented by Greeley showed that the Pacific coast had 1,700,000,000 feet of lumber on hand for next year, and orders for 5,200,000,000 feet.

MELLON REFUSES LOAN TO PINCHOT

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13, (AP)—Governor Gifford Pinchot of Pennsylvania, a staunch crusader, motored into Washington today and asked Secretary of the Treasury Andrew W. Mellon, reputed to be the world's third richest person, to loan the state \$1,000,000 for unemployment relief.

The loan would be repaid in 1933 with 4 per cent interest. "Mr. Mellon did not accept my suggestion, but said he would consider the matter further," Pinchot said later, as he walked into the office of his old friend, Senator George W. Norris, republican.

Rum Running Plane Taken in Arizona

PHOENIX, Ariz., Nov. 13, (AP)—That aerial delivery of whiskey from Mexico to the United States has been in progress was revealed today by the seizure of an alleged rum running airplane near Florence, Ariz., 60 miles from here.

The ship was enroute to Mexico, according to John H. Udall, deputy prohibition administrator for Arizona, and made a forced landing at Florence where the pilot, long sought as a liquor running suspect, was recognized.

SPAIN DECLARES ALFONSO GUILTY

MADRID, Nov. 13, (AP)—Don Alfonso Bourbon-Hapsburg-Lorraine, former king of Spain, was found guilty of "the crime of lese majeste against the sovereignty of the Spanish people," by decision of the parliamentary responsibilities committee which made its formal report and accusation to the Spanish cortes tonight.

Accused of having attempted to seize absolute personal power, the former ruler was declared subject to the death penalty, but the committee proposed "perpetual imprisonment" instead. It Alfonso ever steps foot on Spanish soil.

The ex-Spanish king was found guilty of "leading a military rebellion destined to convert the form of representative government into absolute personal power, and thereby, during seven years, depriving the people of their fundamental liberties and rights."
