O. S. C. Substitute Barred From Game

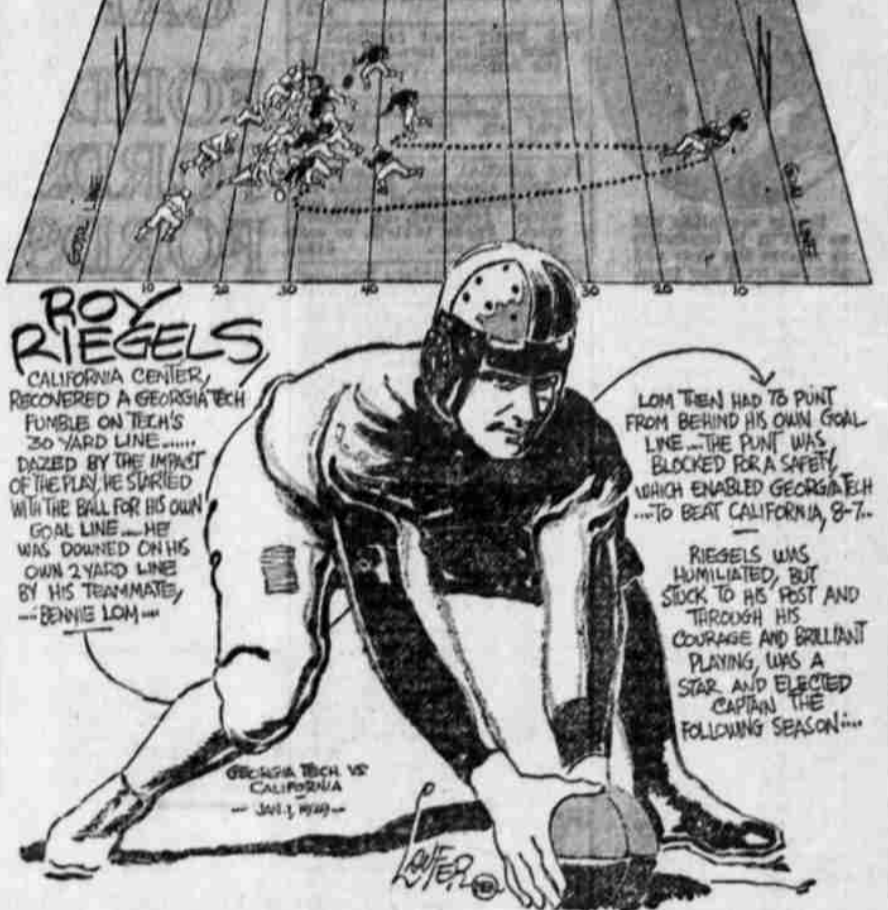
