MOSCOW, Dec. 16 (U.P.)—While Christendom prepares to celebrate its greatest holiday, the Russian Society of Godless is intensifying its campaign during the Christmas to increase the number of atheists in the Communist state from 5,000,000 to 10,000,000 by the end of 1932.

The efforts of the godless society will be less noisy and more effective than heretofare, according to Alexander T. Lukachevsky, national secretary, who told the United Press scientific education would replace propagands and demonstrations.

Program Outlined

The godless organization will stempt the following program during the Christmas period, up to January 15:

(1) Short-term courses to prepare anti-Christmas lecturers in all parts of the country.

(2) Meetings of social organisations in all cities for anti-religious work to counteract the holiday appeal, especially in the new industrial centers. Tens of thousands of peasants fresh from the backward villages are reached in these centers.

(3) The organization of "godless shock troops" on Christmas day, pledged to work harder and serve as pace setters for their "superstitious fellow workers."

(4) A special drive for women members of the society in an effort to raise the percentage of women enrolled from 30 to above 49.

(5) Twenty travelling anti-religious exhibitions sent into the most remote villages.

(6) All enormous quantity of printed matter, posters, wall newspapers, books and leaflets to be distributed during the Christmas season. Two of the books were devoted to anti-religious plays suitable for the season.

(7) A ngtional radio meet-

(7) A national radio meeting organized for Christmas eve. to discuss the five-year plan at the time the churches will be opening the holiday in traditional fashion.

Lukachevsky said many new "anti-religious universities" had been opened in recent months, bringing the total to \$5. Forty new anti-religious museums were opened, most of them in abandoned churches.

Lukachevsky vigorously denied foreible methods were used in closing churches or propagandising against religion. He said a vote of the population always decided whether churches, synagogues and mesques should be closed.




