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HIGH TARIFF WALL HITS U. S. TRADE

LONDON, Dec. 18, (AP)—The tariff wall, which Great Britain is raising against foreign goods, was built higher today when the board of trade issued its third "anti-dumping" order, imposing 50 per cent duties on cotton manufactures and other articles which normally are imported heavily from the United States.

The third order, which will affect American trade more than either of the two earlier lists, was issued coincident with indications that an important political realignment is developing as a result of the Conservative party tariff policy.

Prime Minister J. Ramsay MacDonald was said on reliable authority to be contemplating formation of a "center party" composed of the remnants of David Lloyd George's Liberal party and the right wing Laborites. It was understood that MacDonald had consulted with prominent labor party leaders, despite the fact the party repudiated him when he became head of the coalition cabinet.

Job Saves Son

"Legs" Diamond Found Not Guilty

TROY, N. Y., Dec. 18, (AP)—A jury tonight found Jack "Legs" Diamond, New York gangster, not guilty of kidnaping a farmer truck-helper to learn the location of a still.

The jury returned its verdict after more than five hours of deliberation at 8:50 p. m.

A cheer rose from the half-filled courtroom as the verdict was read. Mrs. Diamond, sitting in a front seat, wept with happiness. Diamond leaped to his feet, and almost shouted as he wrung the hands of his attorneys.

Officials Scout Gold Abandonment

WASHINGTON, Dec. 18, (AP)—Administration officials today belittled suggestions that the United States might abandon the gold standard.

The country could not do so even if it wanted to, it was emphasized in one high source.

Nearly all securities and government obligations are payable in gold dollars, with the fineness of the gold specified.

BODIES OF THREE MEN DISCOVERED

RAVENNA, Ohio, Dec. 17, (UP)—Bodies of three men who had been shot to death, were found on the floor of a cottage near Geauga lake today.

The house had been occupied by William R. "Bugs" Spejna, one of the victims, whose sweetheart, Mrs. Jenny Field, killed herself in the same cottage two weeks ago.

Police said Spejna and the other two victims, identified as "Pat" Murphy and "Shorty" Korner, were well known bootleggers.

Spejna's body was in the bedroom. His hand grasped a revolver from which four shots had been fired. Near him was another revolver and rifle. The floor was littered with shells.

Government Asks Right To Water For Two Projects

SALEM, Dec. 18, (AP)—The United States government has made applications for permits to appropriate water in Oregon for two important projects, C. E. Stricklin, state engineer, announced today.

One is for a permit to store 38,000 acre feet of water for irrigation from Powder river in Baker and Union counties. The federal government is constructing the Thief Valley reservoir on the river near North Powder, and expects to have the project completed by next spring.

The other is permit for storage of 120,000 acre feet of water from the north fork of the Malheur river for the proposed construction of the Agency Valley reservoir near Beulah, for irrigation purposes.

Post-Mortem Waits While Body Thaws

VANCOUVER, B. C., Dec. 18, (AP)—A post-mortem cannot be held on the body of Mrs. John Pop, who may have been murdered, until the corpse thaws out.

Two officers arrived at Williams Lake today with the body after a three-day trek through a snow storm in sub-zero weather.

Mrs. Pop died suddenly in great agony Sunday at Kitchley, a remote village in the Cariboo section.

LONDON, Dec. 18, (AP)—The government announced today that construction of some warships on the 1932 naval building program may be somewhat delayed for "reasons of economy."

It was stated officially, however, that there was no question of suspension of the 1932 building program, as the Daily Herald had stated was considered probable.
