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### SALLIES

LAKEVIEW, Ore. — More snow has fallen at Lakeview during this December than at any time since the United States department of agriculture established a weather observation office here in 1912. Seventeen and a half inches have already fallen this month.

The combined snow fall for November and December has exceeded 20 inches. In 1913, and again in 1922, the snowfall here during the month of December amounted to 16.6 inches. In December, 1917, and in December, 1920, less than an inch of snow fell.

The snow is now four feet on the level in Camas prairie. The county court has decided it will be cheaper to employ teams to pull the mail stage and other vehicles through the deep snow drifts in Camas prairie than to attempt to use snow plows there or to keep the road open from the north end of Warner valley down to the Yellowstone cut-off.

At the Tom Young residence in South Lakeview the snow piled up so high against the side of the house that the children of the neighborhood are sliding off the roof and on to the snow drift.
