## POSTAL SCALES HERE GIVEN INSPECTION

Daniel L. Skoog, inspector mechanic of scales for the United States post office department in Klamath Falls from his offices

As an example of the difference in the scale might make post office officials point out that on packages that difference might cost the government, or the person mailing the package, from one cent to 14 cents. ## Ex-Convict Becomes Trustee at Prison He Served Sentence

HARRISBURG, Pa., Jan. 12, (UP)—Henry G. Brock, son of a wealthy Philadelphia family, who served three years in an eastern penitentiary for second degree murder, tonight became

a member of the board of trustees of the institution, in which he served his sentence. Never discouraged by the prison term, Brock, now 46 years old, regained his place in society through his interest in welfare work among former convicts and through his untiring efforts as a member of the board of prison inspectors for Philadelphia county.

DOCK WORKER DROWNED PORTLAND, Jan. 12, (AP)—Losing his balance as he attempted to throw a line from a wharf to a ship, A. J. Foster, 66, dock employe, drowned in the Willamette river here last night. Dark-ness rendered rescue attempts futile although Foster shouted for help before he sank. The body was recovered two hours after the accident.
