

## POLICE LOSE GUN STRUGGLE WITH TRAPPER

AKLAVIK, Northwest Territory, January 14, (AP)—Eight weary, half-frozen members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police returned today to Aklavik, after losing a 15-hour gun battle with a "hush crazy" trapper who barricaded himself in a dungen-like cabin.

The police even used dynamite in their attack and blew half the roof off the cabin from which Albert Johnson blazed a hail of lead at them from two automatic pistols.

**Fight Through Night**  
Johnson, wanted for attempted murder of a police constable who once entertained Col. Charles A. Lindbergh, backed into a hillside tunnel when the explosive was tossed, escaped injury, and fought on.

For 15 hours the squad of eight policemen fought Johnson in the semi-darkness of the Arctic night, but they could not rout him from his cabin, which is mostly underground and built like a tiny fort.

After more than a day of constant fighting the police were forced to retreat and hurry back to civilization because they were suffering so severely from the cold and were almost out of meat for their dog teams.

The governor concerned himself immediately with the charge of a house naval subcommittee in Washington that his pardon of a man involved in an attack case had caused the lawless element to believe such a crime could be committed here without serious consequences.

The committee's report called attention to "the case in which one Ahakeulu pleaded guilty to the crime of assault and attempt to ravish and was sentenced to an indeterminate term of four months to 15 years. Later he was given a pardon by the governor of the islands upon the theory that his services were needed as an amateur boxer at Madison Square Garden in New York City, representing the territory of Hawaii."

"It may be here stated that this same person if one of the five who was charged with the atrocious crime committed against the wife of an officer of the United States navy."

**Rangers Feeding Feathered Guests**

Perhaps a dozen species of birds are included in the group that is fed daily by the rangers: the raven, Clark's crow, Oregon jay, Steller jay and Williamson sapsucker, and an occasional junco and chickadee. Aside from these few birds, wild life is almost entirely absent from the park at this time of the year.
