

### 3 POLICEMEN DROPPED FOR ECONOMY RULE

Three members of the city police force were dropped temporarily from the city payroll Saturday night for conformity with the order of the city council reducing the force to eight men and the chief, Guy Merrill, chief of police announced Monday.

Officers who were released from duty are Sam Huddley, over three years' experience; B. M. Reed, traffic officer who did not take the civil service examination, and was not on the eligible list for appointment; and C. LaLonde, patrolman for the last year.

Officers on duty are Sergeant Carl Cook, A. McKinnon, desk officer; Don Hayes, George McDonald, Ray Lyons, Chris Steadland, Charles Duggan and Paul Gravelle.

Chief Merrill stated that by February 9, end of the 30-day period he has for making appointments from the list of men submitted by the civil service commission on January 9, he will appoint all members of the department from the list and ask confirmation of them by the civil service commission.

## Large Audience Charmed By Jose Iturbi in Piano Concert at Auditorium

To hear Iturbi for the first time is an experience never to be forgotten. From the moment the brilliant young Spanish pianist stepped onto the platform last night he dominated his audience with the force of his personality. His program, ranging from the deceptive simplicity and crystalline beauty of the Scarlatti Sonatas, through Chopin and the interesting dissonances of the Debussy and Ravel and Albeniz numbers was pure joy.

The Mozart Sonata in A Major was exquisite. Critics have said that "He plays Mozart as Mozart himself must have played it; with consummate taste, poise and patrician style."

His phrasing, technique and consummate art are matchless. The superb melody and simplicity of Mozart, that great composer's facility and skill, were Iturbi's, and he held his audience entranced until the last chord of the Allegretto (alla turca) had died away.

The colossal variations on a "Theme of Paganini" by Brahms, with which Iturbi closed the first half of his concert, are of the most difficult and exacting works ever written for the pianoforte, left his listeners breathless, and he was forced to return again and again in answer to enthusiastic applause.

The second half of the Iturbi concert was thoroughly lovely. It opened with three Chopin études, each a gem in itself, with the color and imagination for which his composer is famous.

The Debussy numbers, taken from the series known as the "Children's Corner," were full of characteristic atmosphere. The "Serenade in a Poisee" was a charming picture, and "L'isle Joyeuse," full of ray abandon. Towards the end one imagined a hint of a march to that joyous island. It ended with a whimsical touch that brought spontaneous smiles to the faces of the listeners.

**Native Color Shown**  
"Pavane," by Maurice Ravel, was full of interesting harmonic dissonances. The full title of this composition is "Pavane for a Dead Infanta," and is actually intended for the funeral of a royal child. It is done in the modern manner, with an appealing and plaintive melody.

The Albeniz "Fete Dieu a Seville," was a gorgeous tone poem describing a festival day in Seville. Albeniz, outstanding composer of modern Spain, embodies in his compositions tonal color and racial characteristics.

In his interpretation Iturbi secured marvelous effects in pedaling, rhythm and phrasing. The last number chosen by Iturbi in his Saturday night concert, was that favorite of all concert pianists, the Paganini-Liszt "La Campanella." His rendition of this dazzling example of virtuosic bravura pianistic fireworks was faultless, and the soul-stirring trills and

staccato work formed a brilliant climax to his program. Mr. Iturbi was extremely gracious with encores, and returned to his piano to play three extra numbers before his audience consented to let him go.

The first encore was "Valse Brillante," by Chopin. The second, "Africa in Blues," one of the most interesting numbers chosen by the remarkable virtuoso, is a composition of Alexander Tanenman, and done in the American "jazz" manner. The theme of the composition is a negro spiritual, and after its introduction it is worked into a "slow drag," and the "Charleston" movement was brought to a conclusion on the bluest of "blue" notes.

**Large Audience Attends**  
The final encore presented by Jose Iturbi was a grandly successful one of his countryman Albeniz, and was a fascinating Spanish dance, characteristic in rhythm and atmosphere.

Jose Iturbi played to one of the largest and most appreciative audiences ever gathered in Klamath Falls. The community concert series is bringing to this city some of the world's finest artists. Music lovers of Klamath Falls heartily thank those who were instrumental in securing these concerts which will fill a long-felt cultural need.

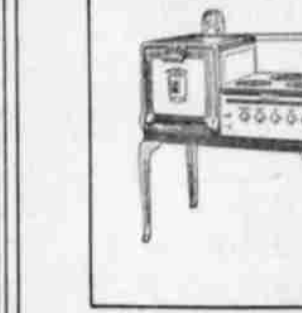
